Ms. Cohen explained the Village has an election date set by Charter. However, due to the municipal elections being held in conjunction with the Presidential Preference Primary on March 19, 2024, the Supervisor of Elections has asked that qualifying close no later than December 15, 2023. She stated the Village can amend their qualifying dates, but they must do so by ordinance.

Ms. Cohen indicated that the ordinance would set the election date for March 19, 2024, and set the qualifying period to run from 12 noon on November 7, 2023 to 12 noon on November 21, 2023.
