10	REFERENCE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT AND SEVERABILITY;
12	AUTHORIZING THE MANAGER TO UPDATE THE COMPREHENSIVE
13	PLAN; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

15	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council, as the governing body, pursuant to the
16	authority vested in it by Chapter 163, Chapter 166, and Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, is
17 18	authorized and empowered to consider changes to its Comprehensive Plan (Plan); and
10 19	WHEREAS, Section 163.3161 et. seq., Florida Statutes established the Local
20	Government Comprehensive Planning and Land Development Regulation Act; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, Wellington adopted its first Comprehensive Plan on January 19,
23	1999, by Ordinance No. 99-01, and updated the entire Comprehensive Plan on August
24 25	10, 2021 by Ordinance No. 2021-14; and
25 26	WHEREAS, the Wellington Comprehensive Plan is consistent with all state
27	requirements; and
28	
29	WHEREAS, Wellington has conducted an annual review of the Capital
30 31	Improvements Element of the Comprehensive Plan as required by Section
31 32	163.3177(3)(b) of the Florida Statutes, and finds the 5-year schedule maintains consistency with Wellington's 2023/2024 Capital Improvements Budget and maintains
33	the adopted levels of service; and

35	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council desires to adopt the update of the current
36	Comprehensive Plan to guide and control the future development of Wellington, and to
37	preserve, promote and protect the public health, safety and welfare.
38 39	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council has taken the recommendations from the
40	Wellington staff and the comments from the public into consideration as part of the
41	review of the proposed amendment to the Comprehensive Plan that are the subject of
42	this Ordinance.

44 45	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON,
