



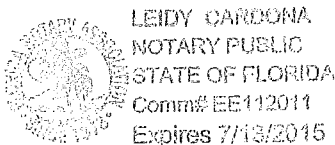

1. Process Control Consultants, Inc. (PCC) has ongoing continuing service contracts with the following municipalities:

- a. Wellington WTP – This contract has been active for 18 years.

PCC supplies system modifications and additions, maintenance, corrective actions (normal working hours and emergency) and other process needs as required. This contract supplies control system support for all systems of overall plant operation.

Off-site systems, RO wells, Lime wells and Booster Stations, are included in this contract.

The plant control system consists of the following PLC/PAC (Programmable Logic Controllers/Programmable Automation Controllers) processors and associated I/O:
