PURPOSE: The purpose of this Addendum/NOTICE is to make changes, additions, deletions, revisions, and clarifications to the Invitation to bid (ITB) documents for the Stormwater Pump Stations Nos. 3,4,6,7,8 and 9 Improvements. Bidders shall review the Addendum requirements in detail.

1. Question: What is the engineer's estimate/budget cost for this project?

Response: The engineer's estimate for this project is \$5,340,000.

2. Question: Does the original bid bond need to be mailed prior to the bid opening?

Response: If bid is submitted electronically, a copy will suffice; however, If your company is awarded this solicitation, then you would be required to deliver the original to the Village of Wellington.

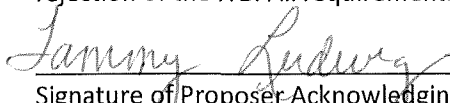
3. Question: Please confirm if there are any SBEs/DBEs requirements.

Response: This project will be partially funded by a FDEP grant. The Village is also actively working to secure additional grant funds for this project. The Village encourages SBE and MBE participation, when possible, but no goal has been set at this time.

4. Question: We are requesting for the Bid Form be revised to Lump Sum for each Pump Station to allow the Prime Bidder awarded to furnish the Schedule of Values.

Response: Thank you for providing your input on the bid form. After further evaluation with staff, and the engineer of record, we have decided the bid forms will remain in its current state.

ADDENDUM NO. TWO

PURPOSE: The purpose of this Addendum/NOTICE is to make changes, additions, deletions, revisions, and clarifications to the Invitation to bid (ITB) documents for the Stormwater Pump Stations Nos. 3,4,6,7,8 and 9 Improvements. Bidders shall review the Addendum requirements in detail.

1. **Question:** It is called out in the description that the contractor shall provide flood protection throughout the project. Can you share insights on what would constitute flood protection?

Response: For this particular project providing flood protection shall be maintaining a minimum of one pump operational at each pump station during construction. If a full shut down is required at a pump station during the course of construction, coordination and/or approval by the Village of Wellington shall be required.

2. **Question:** For the bid, contractors are also required to submit a hurricane preparedness plan prior to construction. Is there a template that contracts would be using?

Response: No, Wellington does not have a template.

3. **Question:** G-04 Material schedule only shows material for the exterior below and above grade. There is no mention of products to be used in the interior of the building. What products are to be used?

Response: The contractor shall use EMT materials of construction inside the interior of the building.

4. **Question:** P3-E4 note 4 shows a J-Box to be used for the MTS. What is the intent of this box?

Response: The purpose to the J-Box is to facilitate routing of conductors between ATS, MTS and main, as well as to allow for the existing portion of conduit between the ATS to main to be reused.

5. **Question:** P3-E1 specific electric note 3 talks about conduit penetrations the back of the MCC through the wall to feed VFDs. Can we stay inside the building with the conduits?

Response: The penetrations we are making reference to are the VFD equipment inside the MCC and the conduit penetrations that come out of the MCC rear section and outside the building in conduit to the existing pumps. Attached are the three pictures that show the following:

Picture 1 is of the exterior wall showing large diameter conduit for the pumps that come out of the rear of the MCC; this wall along the interior happens to be at the rear of the MCC.

Picture 2 is for an RVS MCC section or an MCC bucket with a Reduced Voltage Starter.

Picture 3 is for a VFD MCC section or bucket; both pic2 and pic 3 show the pump cables leaving the starter or VFD and existing the MCC at the rear.

The portion of black blub that you see the cables disappear into is the putty duct seal used to seal and isolate the warm humid air from outside into the MCC enclosure through the conduit.

6. **Question: This project is 180 calendar days to substantial. Our company feels that is cannot be done in this timeframe. We request that the substantial be increased to 365 calendar days.**

Response: Additional days for procurement of specialty electrical items will be granted with approved documentation. We would delay construction NTP until a date certain that the materials would be ready. We would also like to ODP (Owner Direct Purchasing) most of the materials to save on taxes and pass through costs, if possible. Wellington may consider issuing a Notice to Procure and a Notice to Proceed, to differentiate material time and construction time, once lead times are confirmed.

7. **Question: Page 156 of the "Bid Documents and Specifications" makes mention of the Davis-Bacon Act. Do Davis-Bacon wages apply to this project? If so, can the applicable wage determination be provided as part of the bid documents?**

Response: This project will be partially funded by a FDEP grant. The Village is also actively working to secure additional grant funds for this project. Davis-Bacon wages do not apply at this time with the State funded FDEP grant. Appendix II to Part 200, Title 2 was included in the bid documents in the event the Village receives Federal grant funds in the future. Davis-Bacon wages and other federal provisions may apply in future. Wellington will work with the awarded vendor to ensure compliance and compensation.

8. **Question: Under which bid item should the emergency light fixtures at Pump Station #6 be included?**

Response: Unlike all of the other stations, Pump Station No. 6 does not require interior lighting, therefore, there is NO Interior Lighting and Emergency Lighting bid item to put the emergency lighting fixture under. The emergency light fixtures for Pump Station No. 6 shall be under Bid Item 6-14 Pole Mounted Fixture.

9. **Question: Spec Section 16000 1.11 A 16 Calls for the contractor to provide new PTZ CCTV camera matching the Village Standard. Can these standards be provided along with type of mounting bracket that is required?**

Response: The contractor shall provide 12" standard wall mounting arm for PZT CCTV camera.

10. **Question: Who is responsible for integrating the new cameras into the existing CCTV system?**

Response: The contractor shall provide a CCTV subcontractor to perform integration of the CCTV system(s).

11. **Question: Is there a specification or model number available for the "Camlock Connection Panel"?**

Response: The Camlock Connection Panel shall be provided by one of the following approved UL listed vendors: Asco, Powertron, or Power Assemblies.

12. **Question: Specification 16900 Instrumentation & Controls section 1.02 A. requires a Single Instrument and Control (I&C) supplier. Further to that, section 1.02 C. names a specific firm however with "no**

equal". Section 1.02 B. states that "the full responsibility for the requirements of this section will reside in an organization which is qualified and experienced in the wastewater treatment field and its process technology." Based on the Village's desire for qualified and experienced I&C firms, we respectfully request that the Village add Champion Controls as an approved I&C firm on this project.

Response: Specification 16900 will remain as is.

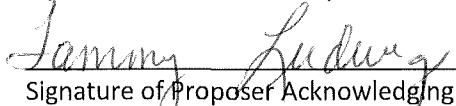
13. Question: On the References & Prior Experience form. How many references is needed?

Response: A minimum of five (5) projects with similar scope and values are required. Failure to complete the References & Prior Experience form may result in the bid being declared non-responsive.

14. Question: Spec Section 16050 3.02 A. 1. Refers you to the material schedule on plan sheet G-04 for conduit type and area use. This schedule call for the use of PVC Schedule 80 conduit for exposed installations. All of the existing conduit in the pump stations is currently rigid galvanized steel. Please confirm the use of PVC conduit for exposed installations".

Response: Please refer to Question 3 for the response.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: Proposers must acknowledge receipt of any and all Addenda. Failure to do so may result in rejection of the ITB. All requirements of the proposal documents remain unchanged except as cited herein.

Dear Provider of Services or Goods:

In order to provide services or goods to Wellington, we require that you provide us either proof of workers compensation coverage or proof of exemption.

Employers conducting work in the State of Florida are required to provide workers' compensation insurance for their employees. Specific employer coverage requirements are based on the type of industry, number of employees and entity organization. To determine coverage requirements for a specific employer, the following information is provided by the Bureau of Compliance.

Construction Industry - One (1) or more employees, including the owner of the business who are corporate officers or Limited Liability Company (LLC) members. For a list of the trades considered to be in the construction industry see 69L-6.021 Florida Administrative Code.

Non-Construction Industry - Four (4) or more employees, including business owners who are corporate officers or Limited Liability Company (LLC) members.

Please note: Non-construction industry Sole Proprietors or partners in a Partnership are not employees unless they want to be included on the business' Workers' Compensation Insurance policy and file a form DWC 251 with the Division of Workers' Compensation.
