11	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council is authorized and empowered to adopt and							
13	amend legislation to govern the affairs of its citizens and promote the public health, safety,

20	WHEREAS, the Wellington Town Center was designed to be dog-friendly so that							
21 22	members of the public can walk around outdoors with their leashed dogs, except in areas where dogs are prohibited by posted signage; and

24	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council believes that it is in the best interest of the							
25 26	community to amend Section 14-18 to reflect such intent and provide clarity to members of the public who may visit Town Center for community events or otherwise.

28	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON,							
29	FLORIDA, THAT:							
30 31	SECTION 1: Chapter 14, Article III, Division 1, Section 14-18 of the Code of							
32	Ordinances, Wellington, Florida, is hereby amended to read as follows:

34 25	Sec. 14-18: Wildlife							
35 36	A. "Wildlife creature" means any animal, bird, mammal, reptile, amphibian, fish, or							
37	invertebrate.

39 40	B. No person shall molest, harm, frighten, kill, net, trap, snare, hunt, chase, shoot or							
40 41	throw or propel missiles, by any means, at any wildlife creature roaming free about a park or in captivity, nor shall any person remove or possess the young of any							
42	wildlife creature, or the nest or eggs of any wildlife creature, or collect, remove,							
43	possess, give away, sell or offer to sell, buy or offer to buy, or accept as a gift any							
44 45	specimen, dead or alive.

C. No perso	on shall	place,	dump,	abandon,	or	leave	any	wildlife	creature	on	the
grounds	of any p	ark.									

- D. No person shall bring or allow any animal or other household pet in any Wellington park, except that leashed <u>pets</u> <u>dogs</u> are permitted in the <u>following</u> <u>locations</u>neighborhood parks and the dog park, provided the owner ensures proper disposal of pet waste...:
 - 1. Neighborhood parks
 - 2. The Dog Park (dogs may be off leash inside the fenced area of the park); and
 - 3. Outdoors at Wellington Town Center, except in areas where dogs are prohibited by posted signage.

The owner of a dog or other animal that causes damage to a Wellington park shall be responsible for the costs of repairing such damage.

- **D.E.** The prohibitions of this subsection shall not apply to:
 - 1. Horses or dogs used by a law enforcement officer or park security guard in the performance of their duties.
 - 2. Service animals as defined in F.S. § 413.08(d), as amended from time to time, except that the owner of a service animal is responsible for proper disposal of pet waste and for the costs to repair any damages caused by the service animal.
 - 3. Animals or fowl kept by the Department or under its direction.

SECTION 3: Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this 33 Ordinance conflict with any section, paragraph, clause, or phrase of any prior Wellington 34 Ordinance, Resolution, or Municipal Code provision, in that event the provisions of this 35 Ordinance shall prevail to the extent of such conflict.

37 <u>SECTION 4:</u> Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this 38 Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision 39 shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion or part thereof, 40 other than the part so declared to be invalid.

- **SECTION 5:** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption 43 of the Wellington Council following second reading.
