






District 8 - Village of Wellington 2023 Person Crime Arrests (132)










#### 5. Traffic Stops, Traffic Citations, and Written Warnings



Traffic Stops, Traffic Citations, and Written Warnings data generated from initial incidents in P1




#### • 2023 Commercial Vehicle Enforcement:


- Ensures commercial vehicle compliance with Village permits and ordinances.

#### 10. Statistical Comparisons to Similar Situated Communities (cont'd)







#### 11. Response Times to Emergency Calls



Response Times for Priority 1 (Emergency) Calls were generated by the Crime View Desktop Application. Priority 1 Calls include, but are not limited to, crimes that are in-progress, have just occurred or require immediate response. Average Response Time in 2023 increased to 7.36 minutes from 7.12 minutes in 2022, a 3% increase.

### 12. Action Plans, Operations, and Special Initiatives

#### **Fairway Plan Operation:**

On October 1, 2023, the Village of Wellington updated its golf cart ordinances. To educate and bring awareness to the community, the Fairway Operation was launched. CP Deputies distributed golf cart index cards which reflected the new state law and contained the updated VOW ordinances. This initiative ran through the month of October.

#### **Operation Summer Heat:**

Criminal activity tends to increase during the months when school is out. To curb the increase of burglaries and vandalisms caused by juveniles staying out late at night, Operation Summer Heat was conducted. Surveillance was maintained in all major shopping plazas in Wellington with Agents looking for suspicious vehicles and persons. Agents also conducted proactive traffic enforcement to deter juveniles from driving recklessly.

#### **Annual Holiday Action Plan:**

During the 2023 holiday shopping season, "Operation Holiday" was implemented at the Mall at Wellington Green and in the surrounding areas for the second year. The operation ran from November 24 through December 24, 2023, and its key objective was to deter and combat criminal activity by conducting focused patrol and surveillance at businesses at these locations. The goal was to ensure the safety of residents and shoppers at the Mall at Wellington Green, the Village's premier shopping venue.

## 12. Action Plans, Operations, and Special Initiatives (cont'd)

#### **Operation Crash Awareness and Reduction Effort (CARE) Initiative:**

This operation took place on February 12, 2023 during Super Bowl Sunday. District 8 Traffic Deputies conducted traffic enforcement with a focus on speeding violations, drunk driving or driving under the influence violations, motor vehicle crashes, and seatbelt violations to promote traffic safety during and after the big game.

#### **Operation Pit Stop:**

This operation is an ongoing plan that will run from September 15, 2023 through April 15, 2024 and was designed to promote traffic safety for motorists traveling through the Village. District 8 Traffic Deputies participated in this operation and targeted areas that were identified to have a high incident of traffic crashes with injuries and areas where drivers violate posted speed limits.

#### 2023 LPR System:







Vigilant LPR's were brought off-line due to a countywide security breach on May 3, 2023.

Prior to being disabled, District 8 deputies recorded the following:

- Notified of 164 LPR hits in the Village of Wellington
- Recovered 8 stolen vehicles, which resulted in 6 arrests
- Recovered 3 stolen tags

### 14. Law Enforcement Service Plan Objectives

#### **2023 Service Plan Objectives**

- Burglary and Theft Crime Goals:
  - Maintain Burglary and Theft crimes less than 800 cases in 2024.
  - Clear at least 10% of burglaries by arrest.
- Traffic Safety Goals:
  - Maintain a crash rate of less than 3.0 crashes per 100 residents in 2024.

Burglary and Theft crimes are the combined total number of 2023 Burglary, Shoplifting and Theft/Larceny cases.

#### 15. Performance Goals - Burglary and Theft

Performance Goals:

Maintain Burglary and Theft crimes less than 800 cases in 2024. Clear at least 10% of burglaries by arrest.

Result (How did we do on our 2023 LESP Goals?):

- Residential Burglaries decreased 33% from 2022 (36) to 2023 (24).
- Burglary and Theft crimes increased 6% from 2022 (529) to 2023 (561).
  - Surpassed the objective of "less than 800 cases" by 30% (561 cases).
- Of the 220 burglaries in 2023, 19% were cleared by arrest (42).
  - Surpassed the objective to "clear at least 10% of burglaries" by arrest.

### 16. Performance Goals - Traffic Issues

Performance Goal:

• Maintain a Crash Rate (CR) of less than 3.0 crashes per 100 Village Residents.

Result (How did we do?):

- Initial Traffic Stops increased 2% from 2022 (16,288) to 2023 (16,581).
- Crashes increased 3% from 2022 (1,230) to 2023 (1,264).
- The CR per 100 residents increased 3% from a 2022 CR (1.991) to a 2023 CR (2.046).
- PBSO surpassed the objective to "maintain a CR of less than 3.0".

Village of Wellington population was 61,807 in 2022 and 61,788 in 2023. For the Crash Rate (CR) calculation, Crashes are the sum of Crashes and Hit & Run cases and excludes Vehicle Homicide cases.
