Ms Coates informed the committee that Wellington won 2 Traffic Safety awards Wellington was recognized for, The Engineering Department was recognized for the Flashing Yellow Light at the intersection of Wellington Trace and Greenview Shores and the other for the Roundabout intersection at Greenbriar and Ousley Farms.

Ms. Coates also mentioned that Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office District 8 was recognized for their Operation Bent Metal Initiative to reduce traffic crashes in Wellington.

She went on to share the updates of the Gold Cart ordinance at that the second reading is scheduled for August 24, 2021.

Ms.Coates mentioned that prior to the pandemic the committee was working with the Florida Teen Safe Driving Coalition. They were organizing a "Drive to Safe Lives Tour". This is a possible opportunity for the committee to partner with this organization.

PALM BEACH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE DISTRICT 8
WELLINGTON REPORT

Lt. Shaivitz introduced himself to the committee. He explained the Operation Bent Metal initiative which was created to look at some issues with traffic and to keep the crashes down. The Lt. reported that crashes are down by 4% from January to April.

Lt. Shaivitz referenced the PBSO annual report and shared what he feels is the most important slide. The slide he refer to shows the ranking of the cities in the area and where Wellington stands in regards to crime bases on population, residential burglaries, vehicle burglaries and robberies.

He went on to mention that due to COVID-19 more people were at home, which helped to deter crime in the areas. He stated the numbers are continuing to trend downward.

The committee requested that the Village share safety tips on the Wellington website.

PALM BEACH COUNTY FIRE RESCUE REPORT

Chief Tozzi introduced himself to the Committee. Chief Tozzi shared the March 2021 total response time was 6 minutes, 54 seconds. He went on to share the April 2021 total response time was 6 minutes and 58 seconds and May 2021 total response time was 6 minutes 43 seconds.

Chief Tozzi shared with the committee about the trend of hydrogen gas alarms that are coming from golf carts charging. Chief Tozzi Introduced PBC Fire Marshall David Derita and Fire Safety Specialist, Elyse Brown who have both taken the lead on the trend and raised awareness to the public. Fire Marshall Derita gave a presentation on hydrogen gas and the new trend of golf cart charging emitting the gas.

Fire Marshall Derita shared the Golf Cart charging safety PSA.

Mr. Arena thanked them for bringing this trend to the committee's attention.

Ms. Hutman asked if this information could be shared with the Watch captains.

Ms. Coates stated Wellington could share this information and share it with our groups.
