12 13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council is authorized and empowered to adopt and amend legislation to govern the affairs of its citizens and promote the public health, safety, and welfare of the community; and			
17 18 19	7 WHEREAS, Chapter 13, Article II, Section 13-7 prohibits certain activities withir 8 Wellington except as specifically authorized therein; and			
20 21 22 23	WHEREAS, Wellington's Council believes it is in the best interest of the community to amend Section 13-7 of the Code of Ordinances to prohibit the operation of machinery and lawn equipment except for the times expressly set forth therein.			
23 24 25 26	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA THAT:			
27 28 29	<u>SECTION 1.</u> Chapter 13 of the Code of Ordinances, OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, ARTICLE II. – NOISE STANDARDS, is amended as follows [in strikethrough-(deleted) and <u>underlined</u> (added) format]:			
30 31 32	Sec.13-7. – Specific prohibitions.			
32 33 34	The following activities are prohibited:			
35 36 37 38 39	A. Horns, signaling devices: The sounding of any horn or audible signal device of any motor vehicle, boat, engine, machine, or stationary boiler of any kind except as required by law or as a warning. The sounding of any warning device for an unnecessary or unreasonable period of time is also prohibited.			
40 41 42 43 44	B. Public streets and parks: The operating or playing of any radio television, phonograph, musical instrument or similar device on the public rights-of-way or in public parks in a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of 100 feet from the sound source at any time, except as may be exempted by the chapter.

Loud speakers and sound amplifiers: The using or operating of any loud speaker, loud speaker system, sound amplifier, radio, television, phonograph, musical instrument or other similar device within or adjacent to inhabited residential land such that the sound therefrom is plainly audible across the property line of the inhabited residential land at any time. This section shall not apply to any special events, such as parades, festivals, or sporting events, but shall apply to lounges, restaurants, and nightclubs.			

- D. Street sales advertising: The use or operation of any loudspeaker, sound amplifier or 52 musical instrument that produces or reproduces sound that is cast or emitted upon the 53 public streets and sidewalks for the purpose of commercial advertising or for attracting 54 the attention of the public to any particular building, structure, or place when such sound that is emitted is plainly audible across the property line of any inhabited residential land.
- 58 E. Machinery operation and construction work: The operation, including warm-ups, 59 maintenance, or loading/unloading, of any machinery, demolition equipment, 60 construction equipment, excavating equipment, power tools, equipment of semi-61 mechanical devices or undertaking construction work or land clearing, that emits 62 sound across the property line of an inhabited residential land between the hours of 63 10:00 PM 8:00 PM and 7:00 AM, Monday through Friday and 8:00 PM and 8:00 AM, 64 Saturday. All machinery operation and major construction work, including grading and 65 site preparation, assembly, erection, substantial repair, alteration or demolition of the 66 building or structure is prohibited anytime on Sunday. This shall not prohibit individuals 67 from performing home repair or maintenance, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 6:00 68 PM on Sunday nor shall it prohibit the use of pumps or machinery that, because of its 69 70 very nature and purpose, is required to be operated 24 hours a day.
 - F. Lawn equipment: The operation of lawn and garden equipment that emits sound across a property line to inhabited residential land except between the hours of 7:00 AM 8:00 AM and 10:00 PM 8:00 PM Monday through Saturday and between the hours of 9:00 AM and 6:00 PM on Sunday.
 - G. Animal noise: Pursuant to section 4-1 of this Code, Wellington has adopted Chapter 4, entitled "Animals" of the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances, designated as the "Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control Ordinance." In addition to the Palm Beach County Animal Care and Control Ordinance, animal noise originating from real property in Wellington is subject to the noise provisions set forth in this chapter.

83 SECTION 2. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance conflict with any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of any prior Wellington 84 Ordinance, Resolution, or Municipal Code provision, in that event the provisions of this 85 Ordinance shall prevail to the extent of such conflict. 86

SECTION 3. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phase of this 88 Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not 89 affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion or part thereof, other than the part 90 so declared to be invalid. 91

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- **SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption of the 93 Village Council following second reading. 94
