1 **ORDINANCE NO. 2025-17** 2 3 AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL 4 PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 9G OF 5 WELLINGTON'S MUNICIPAL CHARTER RELATING TO THE 6 VILLAGE CANVASSING BOARD BY AMENDING SECTION 9, 7 SUBSECTION G, "VILLAGE CANVASSING BOARD" TO 8 DESIGNATE THE PALM BEACH COUNTY CANVASSING 9 BOARD AS THE VILLAGE'S CANVASSING BOARD AND TO 10 THE REQUIREMENT APPOINT ELIMNINATE то COMMUNITY MEMBER TO THE CANVASSING BOARD; 11 12 PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSED AMENDMENT 13 CHARTER ТО THE ELECTORS OF WELLINGTON AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 14 10, 2026; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE FLORIDA 15 DEPARTMENT OF STATE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; 16 17 PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT: PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND 18 19 **PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.** 20

WHEREAS, Section 166.031, Florida Statutes, provides that the governing body of a municipality may, by ordinance, submit to the electors of the municipality a proposed amendment to the municipality's charter; and

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25 WHEREAS, the Charter currently provides that in municipal elections, the Village 26 Council may, by ordinance, designate the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board appointed 27 by the Palm Beach County Commission and the Chief Judge of the 15th Judicial Circuit as 28 the Village Canvassing Board. In the event the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board is 29 unable or unwilling to canvass a Wellington municipal election, the Village Canvassing Board 30 shall be comprised of those members of the Village Council who are not candidates for 31 reelection, the Village Clerk, and when necessary to avoid an even number, the Deputy 32 Village Clerk or a member of the community and an alternate; and

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WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board routinely canvasses municipal elections, including Wellington's, during uniform municipal election cycles, but the Charter, as currently written, requires Council to adopt an ordinance for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, requiring a separate Village Canvassing Board, including a community
member and an alternate, to serve the same function as the Palm Beach County Canvassing
Board is duplicative and unnecessary; and

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WHEREAS, designating the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board to serve as Wellington's canvassing board during municipal elections without the need for adoption of an ordinance each election cycle results in more efficient government while preserving Wellington's ability to convene its own canvassing board in those instances where the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board is unable or unwilling to canvass a Wellington municipal 1 election; and 2

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WHEREAS, the need to appoint a community member and an alternate as members of the Village Canvassing Board is unnecessary because Wellington has sufficient staff to ensure that its canvassing board will not be comprised of an even number; and

7 **WHEREAS,** Wellington's Council deems it necessary and advisable for the voters of 8 Wellington to consider amending the charter of the Village of Wellington to designate the 9 Palm Beach County Canvassing Board as its canvassing board during municipal elections 10 and to eliminate the requirement for a community member and an alternate to serve in order 11 to avoid an even number of board members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. Section 9, Subsection G. "Village Canvassing Board" of the Village of Wellington Charter is hereby proposed to be amended to read as follows:

G. Village Canvassing Board. The Village Council may, by ordinance, designates the Palm Beach County Canvassing Board appointed by the Palm Beach County Commission and the Chief Judge of the Fifteenth Judicial Circuit to serve as the Village Canvassing Board. In the event the Palm Beach County Canvasing Board is unable or unwilling to canvass a Wellington municipal election, the Village Canvassing Board shall be composed of those members of the Village Council who are not candidates for reelection and the village clerk, who shall act as chairperson. In any Village election in which the Village Canvassing Board is composed of an even number of persons, Council shall appoint the Deputy Village Clerk or a member of the community and an alternate to serve on the Canvassing Board in order to avoid single or even membership. At the close of the polls of any Village election, or as soon thereafter as practicable, the Canvassing Board shall meet at a time and place designated by the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections, or the chairperson of the Village Canvassing Board, and shall proceed to publicly canvass the vote as shown by the returns then on file in the office of the Supervisor or the Village Clerk, and then shall publicly canvass the absentee elector ballots. The Canvassing Board shall prepare and sign a certificate containing the total number of votes cast for each candidate or other measure voted upon. The certificate shall be placed on file with the Village Clerk.

42 **SECTION 2.** The charter amendment proposed by this ordinance shall be submitted 43 to the electors of the Village of Wellington at the election to be held on March 10, 2026 and 44 shall be deemed adopted upon the favorable vote of a majority of the electors voting at that 45 time upon the following question:

In the event of adoption by the electorate as provided herein, Wellington's Clerk shall forthwith incorporate the amendment into Wellington's charter by preparing a true copy of section 9G as amended, and shall file the revised section with the Florida Department of State, at which time the revised section shall take effect.			
27 28 29 30	SECTION 4. Wellington's Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published once a week for four consecutive weeks immediately prior to the election on March 10, 2026.			
30 31 32 33 34 35	<u>SECTION 5.</u> Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance conflict with any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of any prior Wellington Ordinance, Resolution, or Municipal Code provision; then in that event the provisions of this Ordinance shall prevail to the extent of such conflict.			
36 37 38 39 40	SECTION 6: Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion or part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.
