4. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Macy's in Wellington has selected the Students Working to Achieve Greatness (S.W.A.G.) program and the Crowned Pearls to serve as the beneficiary for their Charities Roundup Campaign Program.

Mr. Barnes stated Wellington has been awarded \$747,500 as part of the 2023 U.S. Department of Agriculture Forest Service Urban and Community Forestry Grant Program. The grant funds will be used to restore the urban forest on the 45-acre Moncada property that is being incorporated into the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Everglades Habitat at the Wellington Environmental Preserve. He reminded everyone that the Wellington Environmental Preserve at the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Everglades Habitat has been selected as a finalist for the American Planning Association (APA) Florida 10th Annual Great Places in Florida Award. Mr. Barnes encouraged everyone to vote.
