AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 9C WELLINGTON'S MUNICIPAL CHARTER RELATING CANDIDATE QUALIFYING DATES BY AMENDING SECTION 9, SUBSECTION C, "QUALIFYING FOR OFFICE" TO MOVE THE QUALIFYING PERIOD TO A TWO WEEK PERIOD IN **NOVEMBER PRIOR TO THE MARCH GENERAL ELECTION:** PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT TO THE **ELECTORS** WELLINGTON AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 10, 2026; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF STATE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; **FOR** PROVIDING CONFLICT: PROVIDING CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 166.031, Florida Statutes, provides that the governing body of a municipality may, by ordinance, submit to the electors of the municipality a proposed amendment to the municipality's charter; and

WHEREAS, the Charter currently provides that residents wishing to qualify to become a candidate for a Village elective office must qualify with the Clerk no sooner than noon on the last Tuesday in January and not later than noon on the second Tuesday in February of the year in which the election is to be held; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's municipal elections are held during the uniform municipal elections period, which occurs on the second Tuesday in March of each election year; and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections requires at least 95 days prior to an election to have sufficient time to prepare, print, and test municipal ballots and to convert such ballots into an accessible format for persons with disabilities and has therefore requested that municipalities ensure that their candidate qualifying periods be moved to accommodate such time period; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's Council deems it necessary and advisable for the voters of Wellington to consider amending the charter of the Village of Wellington to move the qualifying period to a two week period during November of the year prior to the March municipal elections; and

WHEREAS, moving the qualifying period to November avoids conflict with various Fall and Winter holidays and promotes participation by those who may seek to become candidates.

21 22 23 24 25 26	BALLOT SUMMARY: To facilitate timely preparation, printing and testing of ballots, the Supervisor of Elections has required that municipalities now submit their candidates for election at least 95 days prior to said election. To accommodate this, a Charter amendment establishing Wellington's official qualifying period to run for the Village Council as a two week period in November, rather than in January, is required.
