1 ORDINANCE NO. 2020-20 2 AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL 3 AMENDING THE WELLINGTON COMPREHENSIVE PLAN, MORE 4 SPECIFICALLY, TO REPEAL THE PUBLIC SCHOOL FACILITIES 5 6 ELEMENT AND THE EDUCATION ELEMENT AND REPLACE WITH THE EDUCATION ELEMENT, IN ITS ENTIRETY, AS CONTAINED 7 8 HEREIN; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 9 10 WHEREAS, the Wellington Council, as the governing body, pursuant to the authority 11 vested in it by Chapter 163, Chapter 166 and Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, is authorized and 12 13 empowered to consider changes to its Comprehensive Plan (Plan); and 14 WHEREAS, after incorporation in 1996, the Wellington Council adopted the first 15 Comprehensive Plan in 1999; and 16 17 WHERAS, Chapter 163, Florida Statutes, requires an Evaluation and Appraisal Report 18 19 (EARs) every seven years to update information and evaluation what changes may be required; 20 and 21 WHEREAS, since its initial adoption in 1999 minor amendments to the Comprehensive 22 Plan have been adopted to address changed conditions and/or to suit specific needs of 23 Wellington to ensure the health, safety, welfare and overall quality of life; and 24 25 WHEREAS, Wellington believes that it is in the best interest of the community to make 26 update the Comprehensive Plan to identify and set the future direction for the next 10 to 20 27 years; and 28 29 30 31

WHEREAS, the proposed amendments to the Comprehensive Plan address updates and new goals, objectives, and policies (GOPs) for all required and optional elements pursuant to Florida Statutes; and

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WHEREAS, each element of the Comprehensive Plan is based upon relevant and appropriate data and analysis, including population projections, studies, plans, and maps, available at the time of adoption of the Comprehensive Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Planning, Zoning and Adjustment Board, acting as the Local Planning Agency, after notice and public hearing on December ____, 2020, has reviewed the proposed Ordinance for consistency with Wellington's Comprehensive Plan and made a recommendation for ____ with a x-x vote; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council has taken the recommendations from the Local Planning Agency, Wellington staff, and the comments from the public into consideration as part of the review of the proposed amendment to the Comprehensive Plan that are the subject of this Ordinance.

NOW THERFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA THAT:

SECTION 1. The Public School Facilities Element and the Education Element of the Comprehensive Plan are hereby repealed, in their entirety, and replaced with the Education Element as presented in Exhibit A of the Ordinance.
