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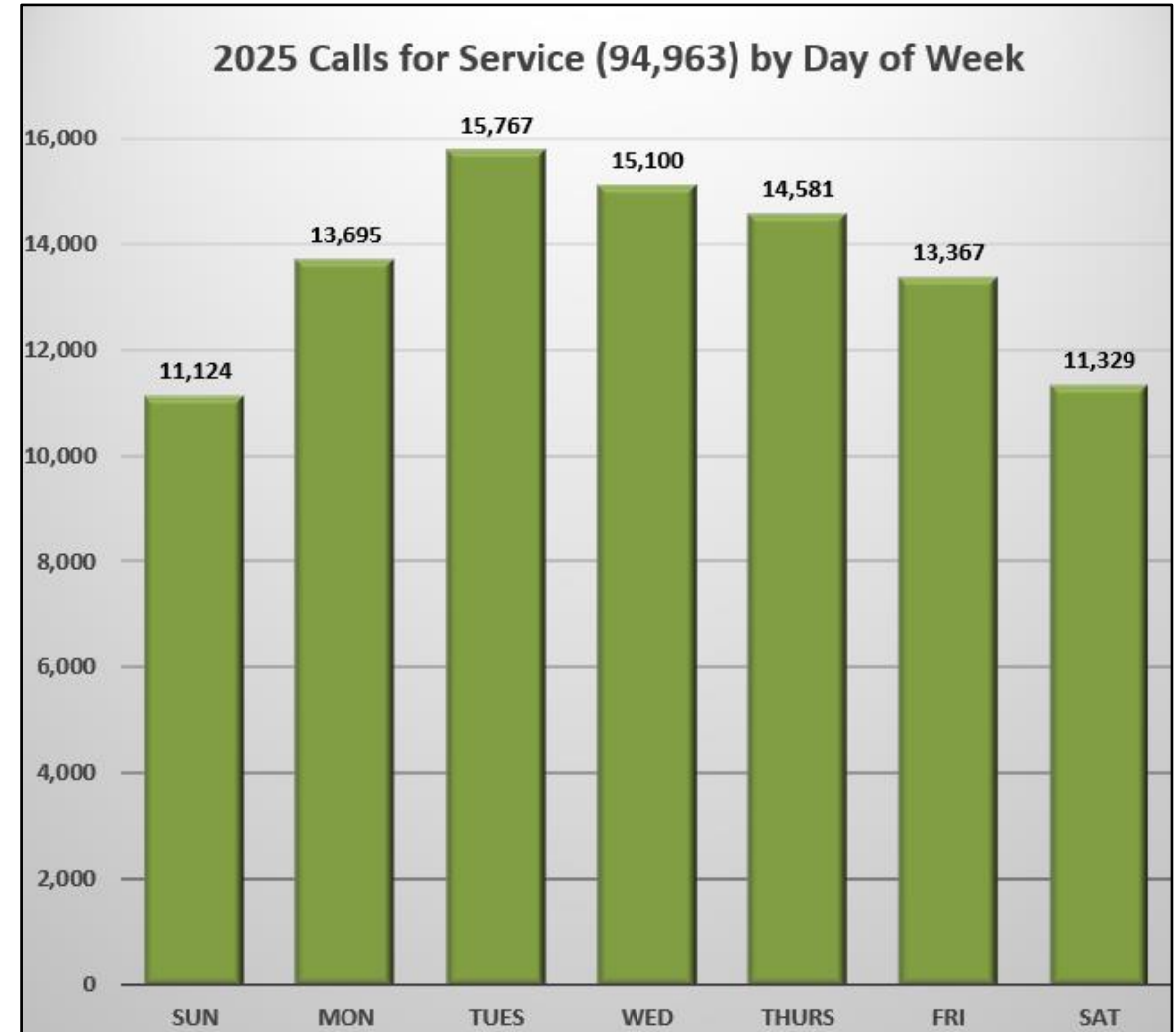

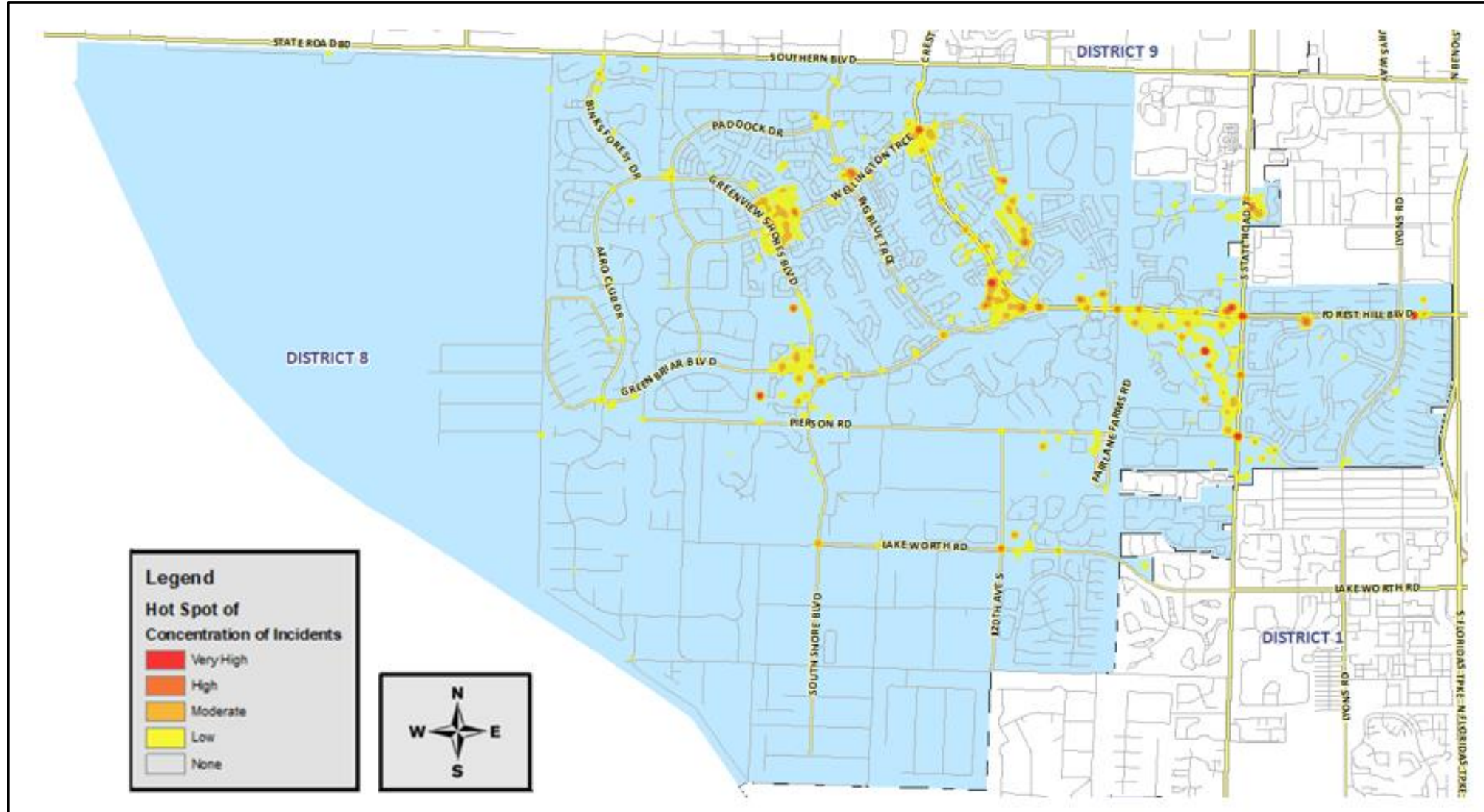

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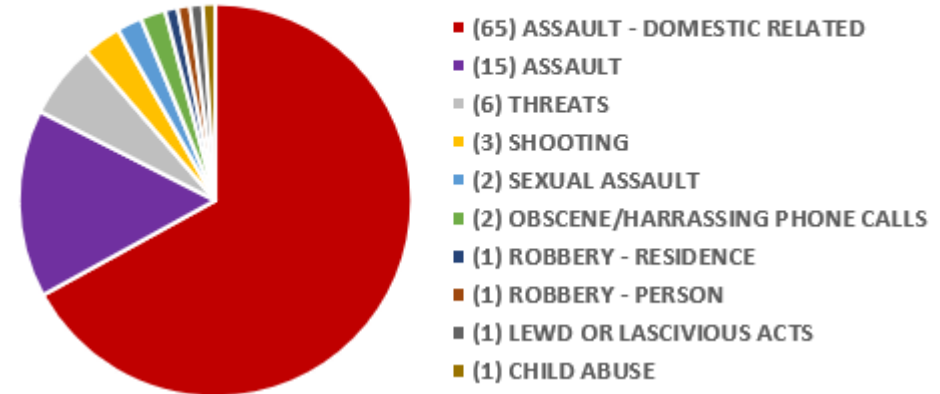

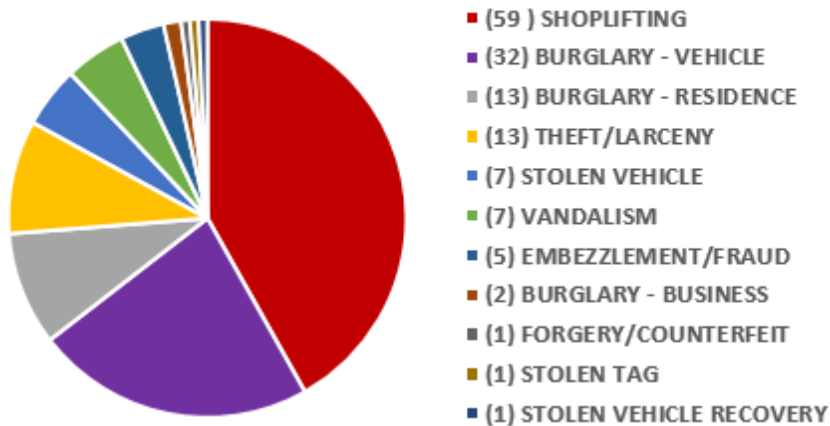

2024 Person Crime Arrests (113)



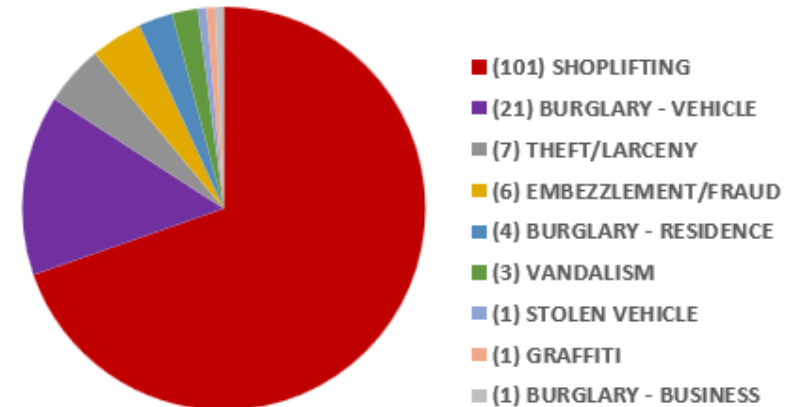
District 8 - Village of Wellington

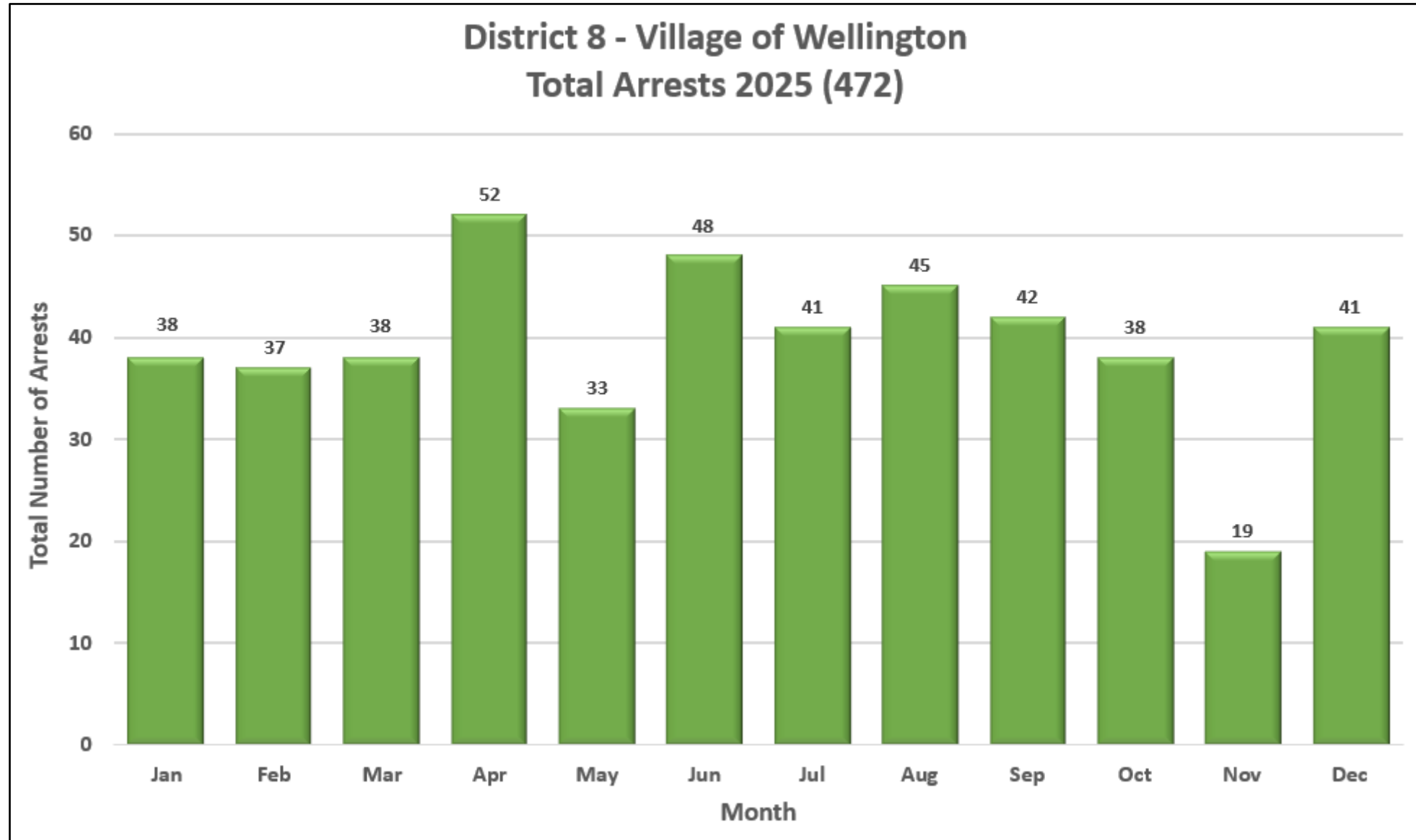

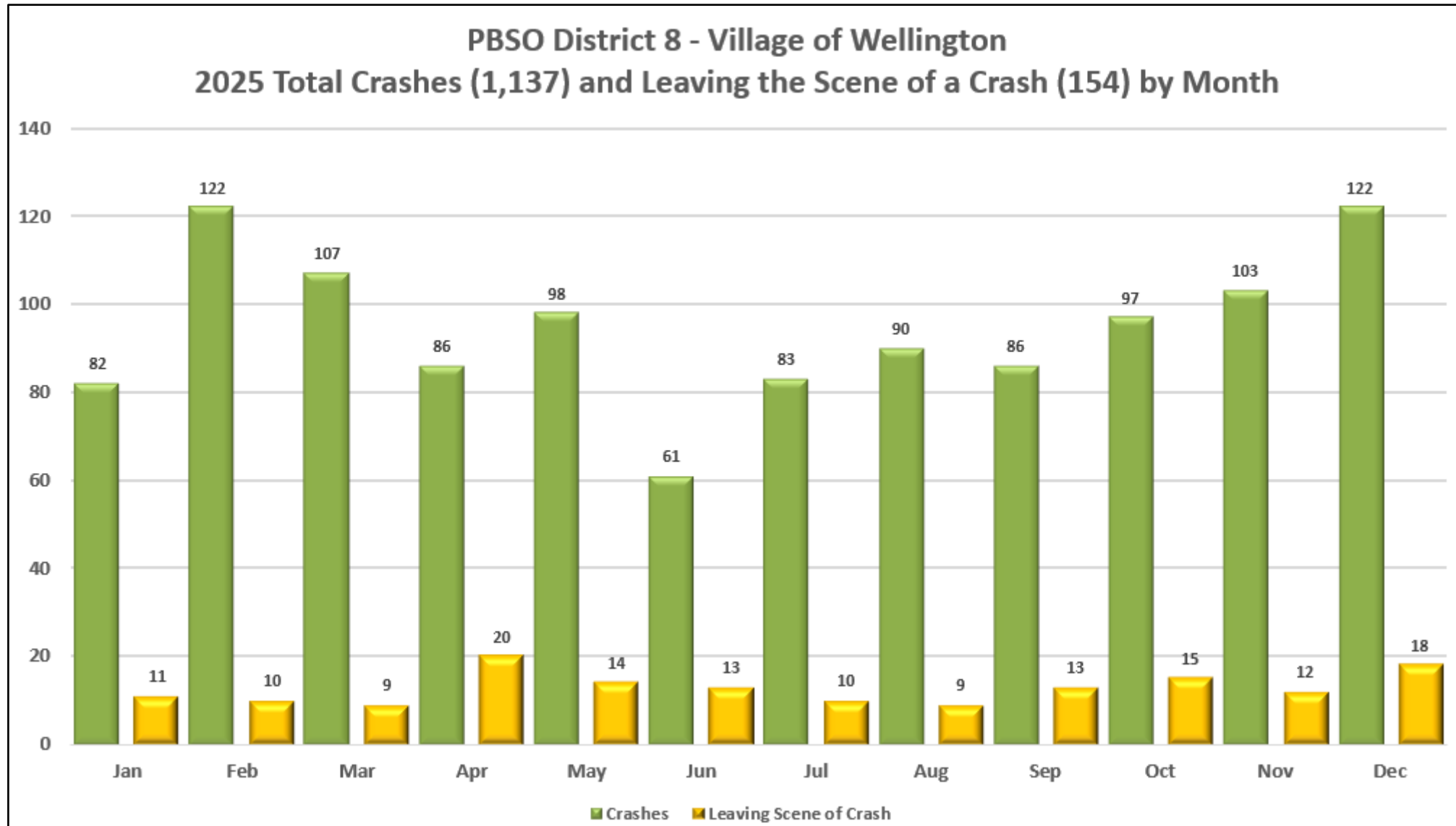

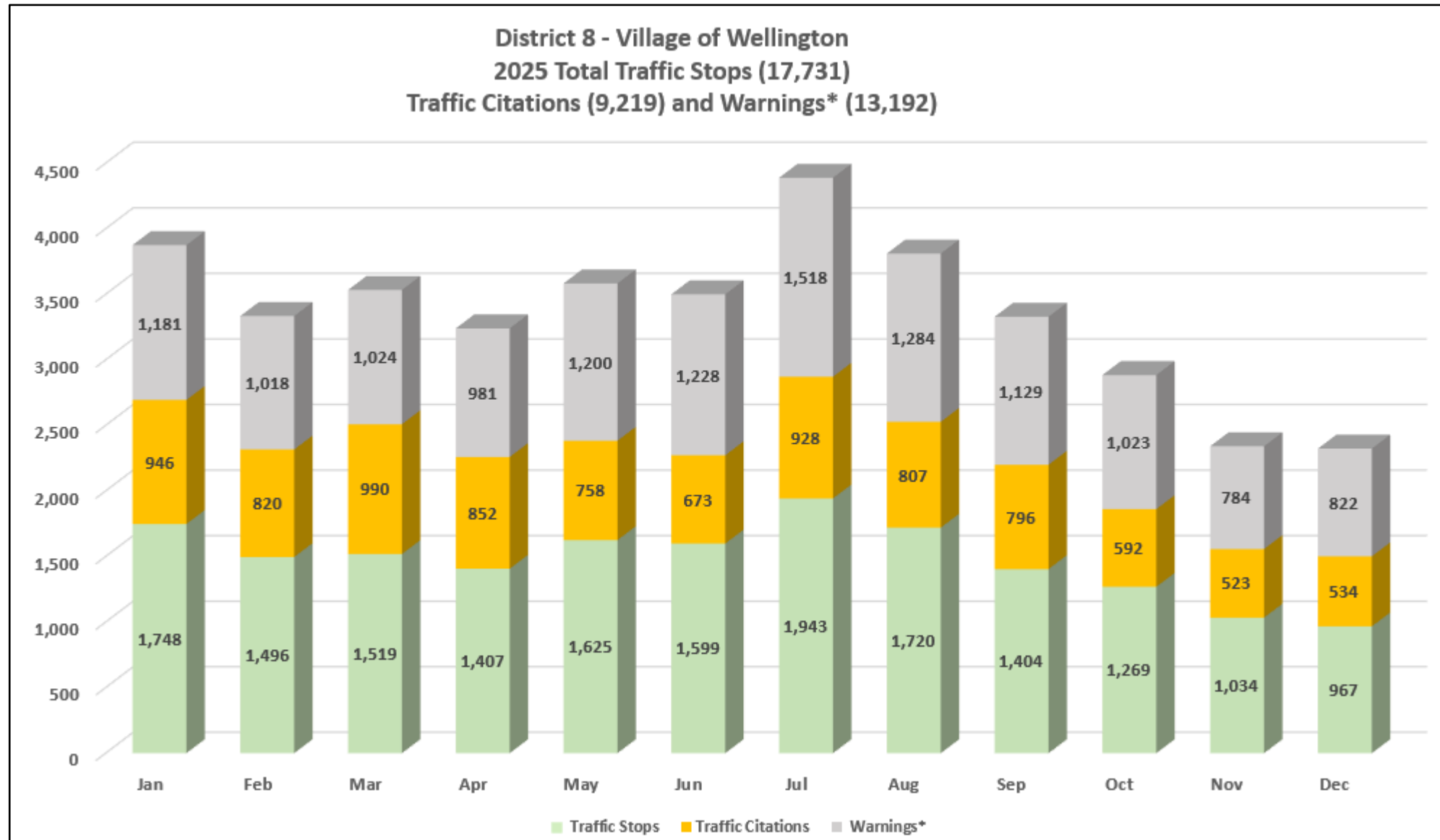

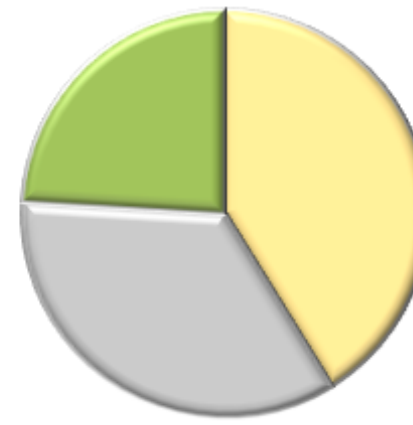

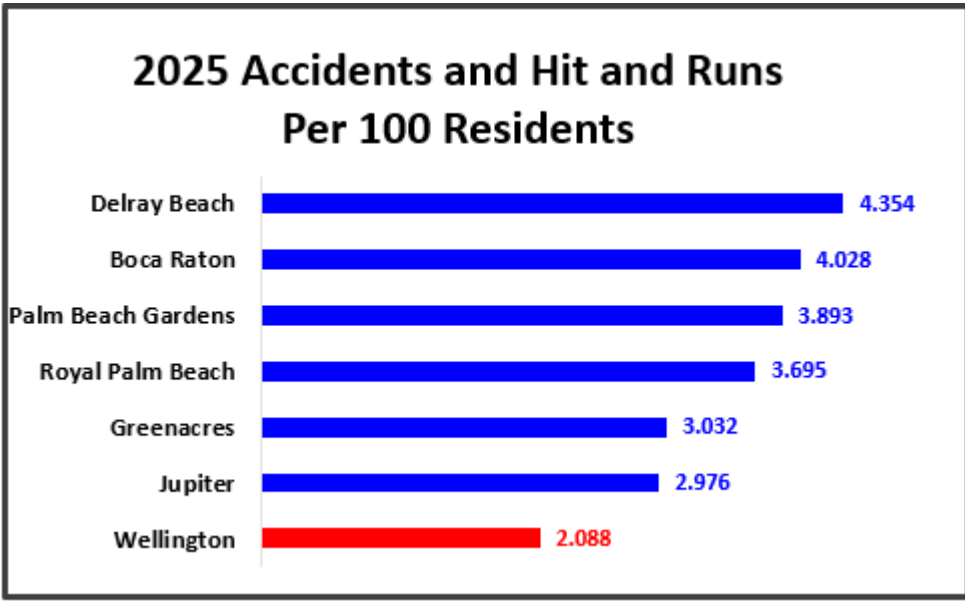
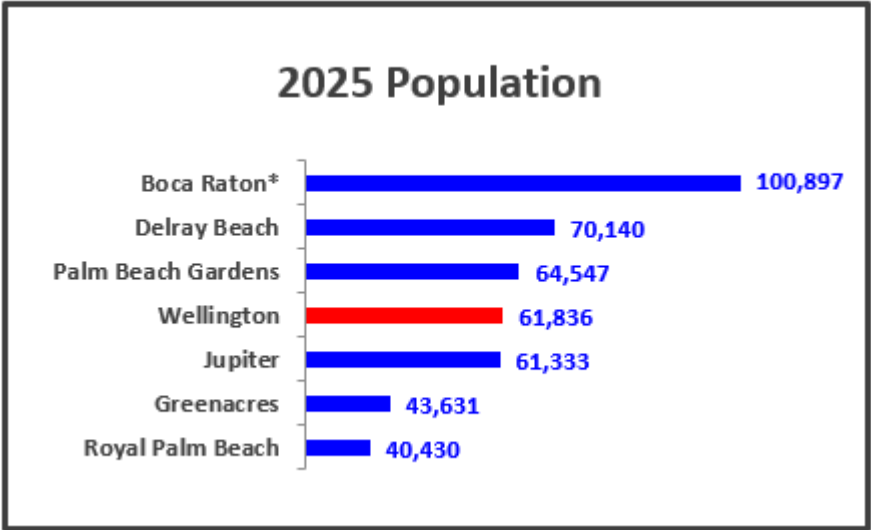
10. Statistical Comparisons to Similar Situated Communities

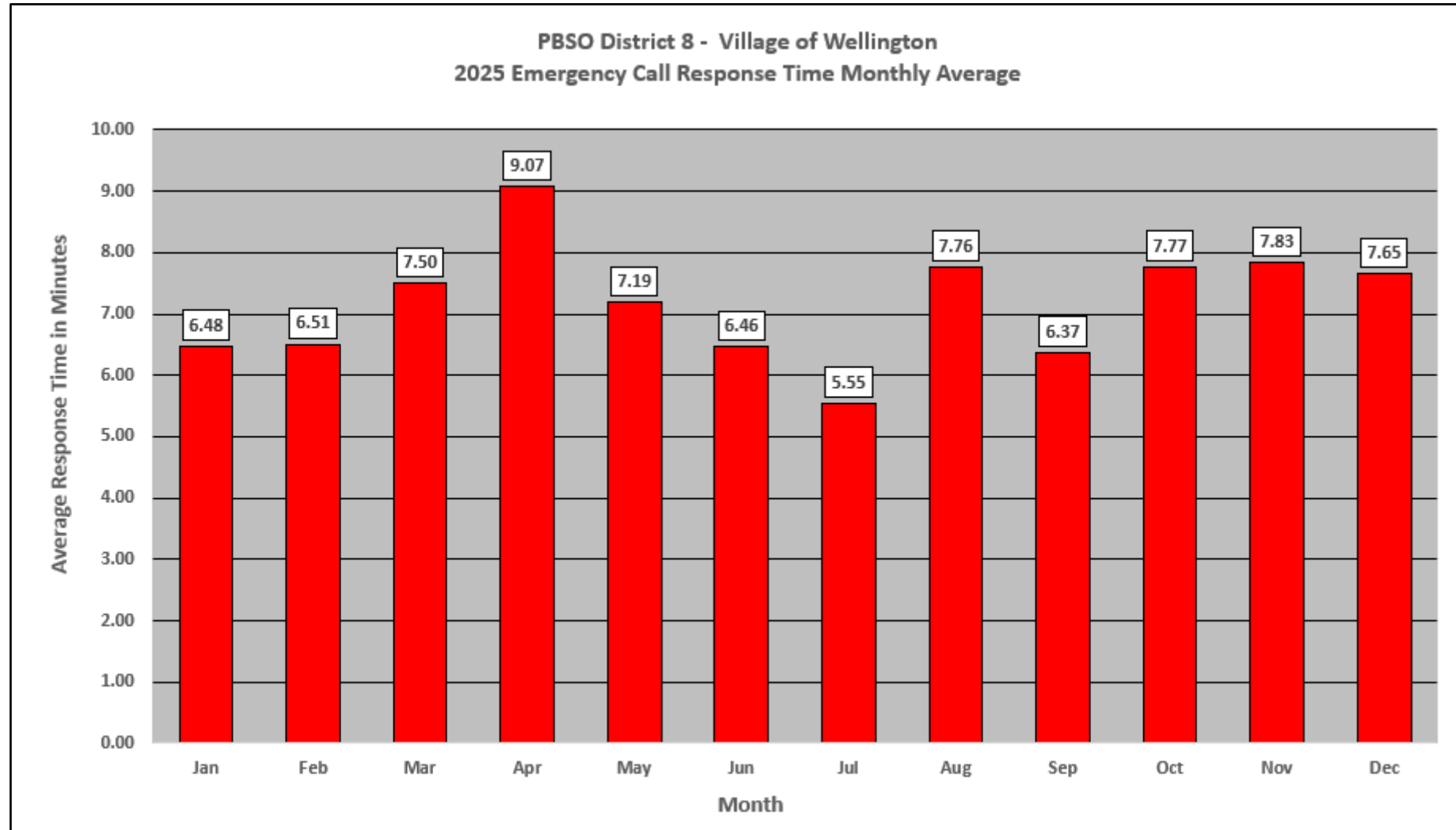

11. Response Times to Emergency Calls



Response Times for Priority 1 (Emergency) Calls were generated by the Crime View Desktop Application.
Priority 1 Calls include, but are not limited to, crimes that are in-progress, have just occurred, or require immediate response.
Average Response Time in 2025 decreased approximately 3% to 7.18 minutes from 7.39 in 2024.

12. Action Plans, Operations, and Special Initiatives

Operation Moto Madness II:

District 8 Street Crimes Unit (SCU), Community Policing (CP) unit, Traffic, and Road Patrol units conducted proactive patrol in multiple locations throughout the Village of Wellington targeting subjects riding electric motorcycles and electric bicycles in an unsafe manner. Agents and Deputies educated subjects on laws pertaining to these vehicles and focused on shopping plazas, residential communities, and equestrian areas. This operation ran from April through June 2025.

Operation Dung Deal:

District 8 Traffic units conducted overt and covert traffic enforcement along Flying Cow Ranch Road in an effort to deter trucks weighing more than 16,000-pounds from using the unpaved road. The operation was conducted from February through March 2025.

Operation Staggering Stag:

District 8 Traffic units were deployed to high crash intersections throughout the Village of Wellington to conduct proactive traffic enforcement in an attempt to prevent impaired driving and promote traffic safety. Deputies disseminated educational material to the public via social media and used the electronic signboard and speed trailer to promote awareness ahead of and during the operation. This operation was conducted during the last weekend of March 2025.

12. Action Plans, Operations, and Special Initiatives (cont'd)

Operation Fairway Plan II:

This operation was implemented to address the increase in golf cart related complaints in the Village of Wellington. District 8 Traffic units and CP units conducted extra traffic enforcement on golf carts, focusing on communities with a high concentration of golf cart traffic. This operation ran for a two-week period during April 2025.

Operation Summer Brake:

This operation began during the Memorial Day weekend and continued through the summer months while students were out of school. The main objective of this operation was to deter juveniles on summer break from committing crimes by increasing Deputy presence throughout the Village of Wellington.

Operation Crooked Car:

District 8 CP units joined the Traffic unit in conducting this operation which focused on parking enforcement in the Equestrian Walk community to address illegally parked vehicles in the community. This operation continued through the end of the year and expanded to other communities throughout the Village of Wellington.

Operation Safe Satchel:

District 8 SCU and CP units patrolled the Wellington Green Mall and other retail centers throughout Wellington in an effort to deter criminal activity. This operation was conducted during the 2025 holiday season.

13. License Plate Readers

2025 LPR System:

In 2025, the Wellington Council members agreed to partner with Jenoptik and approved the installation of Jenoptik speed cameras at all school zones in the Village of Wellington. These automated cameras take snapshots of license plates and mail out fines to drivers traveling more than 10 mph above posted limits in school zones. These cameras are in addition to the 21 Flock LPR cameras installed in 2024.

25114091: District 8 CP units were alerted to a blue Toyota Camry that was reported stolen by Miami Beach Police. The vehicle was located just outside of Wellington at a nearby Home Depot in Royal Palm Beach where contact was made with the driver. The vehicle's status was ultimately determined to be a civil dispute and the driver was released with a citation for driving without a driver's license and the vehicle was towed.

25-098465: District 8 SCU Agents received an LPR alert of a stolen Jeep Gladiator traveling northbound on Forest Hill Boulevard near Quercus. Agents were able to locate the vehicle and tracked it to a Pollo Tropical parking lot in Royal Palm Beach where the vehicle was recovered and the suspect was taken into custody without incident.

25-072435: District 8 SCU Agents received an LPR alert of a white BMW that was reported stolen by Hollywood Police. Agents mobilized and located the vehicle backed into a parking spot in front of the TD Bank in the Village of Wellington. Agents made contact with the driver who was taken into custody without incident.

 - Surpassed the objective of “less than 800 cases” by 47% (423 cases)
- Of the 128 burglaries in 2025, 20% were cleared by arrest (26)
 - Surpassed the objective to “clear at least 10% of burglaries” by arrest

Result (How did we do?):

- Initial Traffic Stops increased 22% from 2024 (14,585) to 2025 (17,731)
- Crashes increased 5% from 2024 (1,227) to 2025 (1,291)
- The CR per 100 residents increased 5% from 1.99 in 2024 to a CR of 2.08 in 2025
- PBSO surpassed the objective to “maintain a CR of less than 3.0”

Village of Wellington population obtained from BEBR: 61,836 in 2025 versus 61,794 in 2024.

For the Crash Rate (CR) calculation, Crashes are the sum of Crashes and Hit & Run cases and includes Vehicle Homicide cases.
