7. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Mr. Barnes introduced the item.

Ms. Hall read Resolution No. R2024-19 by title.

Ms. Cohen stated the Item is Quasi-Judicial and swore in the individuals who wished to speak on the item.

Ex-parte Communications:

Councilwoman Silvestri: Councilwoman Silvestri stated she had spoken with Brian Terry, Aimee Carlson, Maureen Brennan, Steve Gogola, Paty Gustafson-Barr, Tom Gustafson, Kristy Lund, Gail Bayly, Palm Beach County Commissioner Sara Baxter, Jane Cleveland, Brant Crow (sp), Maryanne Westwood (sp), Michael Miskin, Anne Gerwig and staff. She said she could be fair and impartial.

Councilwoman Siskind: Councilwoman Siskind disclosed that she spoke with Brian Terry and his staff, Aimee Carlson, Paty Gustafson-Barr, Tom Gustafson, staff, Dr. Rachel Eidelman. She said she could be fair and impartial.

Mayor Napoleone: Mayor Napoleone disclosed that he spoke with Paty Gustafson-Barr, Tom Gustafson, Brian Terry, and Aimee Carlson. He said he could be fair and impartial.

Vice Mayor McGovern: Vice Mayor McGovern stated he had spoken with the applicant, Michael Mishkin, Paty Gustafson-Barr, Tom Gustafson, Steve Gogola, Kristy Lund and Glen Fleischer. He said he could be fair and impartial.

Councilwoman Antuña: Councilwoman Antuña stated she had spoken with Jill Thompson, Brian Terry, Aimee Carlson, Paty Gustafson-Barr, Steve Gogola, Maureen Brennan and staff. She said she could be fair and impartial.

Brian Terry, PLA/Principal Insite Studio, Inc., on behalf of the applicant, introduced his team members (Andrew Maxey and Aimee Carlson from Pulte Homes; Dr. Juan Ortega, Traffic Engineer; Jeff Schnars, Civil Engineer; and Scott Bachman, Land Use Counsel) and provided an update regarding the project. He referenced discussion points from the June 25, 2024 Village Council Meeting regarding impact and safety of access on 120th Ave South, access from the Isles of Wellington, access from Lake Worth Road, intersection improvement at Lake Worth Road and 120th Avenue South, privacy/visibility concerns from Isles of Wellington residents. In addition, Mr. Terry discussed Single-Story Lot Commitment, Summary of Improvements and changes to Conditions of Approval and new condition for turn lane.

Council asked questions regarding the timeframe for the contract, intersection at 120th and single story lot commitments.

Mr. Terry responded to Council's questions.

Jonathan Reinsvold, Village Engineer, discussed the idea for the speed table and provided suggestions for the roadway.

Vice Mayor McGovern inquired about the chicane and turn lane.

Councilwoman Silvestri inquired about a speed bump at the exit.

Mayor Napoleone referenced a raised crosswalk.

Mr. Schnars, Schnars Engineering, spoke regarding a stop or raised crosswalk.

Public Comment:

- 1. April Clark spoke regarding a previous email she sent and landscaping for the project.
- 2. Paty Gustafson-Barr read a statement into record regarding traffic safety and Vision Zero Action Plan.
- 3. Tom Gustafson discussed a conceptual plan by Ramon Trias regarding the Vision Zero Action Plan in reference to 120th Avenue South and speeding.
- 4. Bernadette Curling spoke regarding her property and Lots 13 and 14 of the Pulte Development.
- 5. Kevin Turner referenced 120th Avenue South and commented regarding the Equestrian Zoning Overlay District and the Equestrian Preserve Committee (EPC) review.
- 6. Maureen Brennan thanked Pulte for the time spent with them today and commented regarding EPC review, speed tables and the intersection.

Councilwoman Siskind asked if the changes make the entire roadway safer or just the entrance to the development.

Mayor Napoleone asked how the culvert will actually slow traffic down.

Mr. Reinsvold responded regarding the speed and design of the road.

Councilwoman Silvestri asked if the driveways on the other side were taken into consideration.

Vice Mayor McGovern inquired about the turn lane.

Mr. Stillings responded regarding the turn lane and design speed.

Councilwoman Silvestri spoke regarding the speed table.

Mr. Reinsvold commented regarding countermeasures to address the speeding on the roadway.

Mayor Napoleone asked about coming up with the best solution for this roadway i.e. a workshop with the EPC to provide input.

Vice Mayor McGovern asked about a condition to do a workshop with EPC to receive their input.

Mr. Barnes stated it would be a workshop for strictly discussion purposes to obtain their input.

Mr. Stillings stated it could be direction to the Village Engineer to seek EPC input pertaining to the entrance impacting 120th, prior to the issuance of permits.

Councilwoman Antuña commented regarding speeding and expressed her concerns with the entrance being on 120th Avenue South.

Mayor Napoleone commented regarding the landscape buffer and asked what could be done to provide more auditory screening.

Mr. Terry stated they could make changes regarding the specifications for the trees/landscaping.

Ms. Cohen spoke regarding the master plan and conditions.

Mr. Stillings indicated that the added landscaping features beyond code requirement could be incorporated in the project standards manual.

Ms. Cohen spoke to Council regarding making a decision based upon the evidence presented in the hearing.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Siskind, and unanimously passed (5-0), to include the additional public comment as part of the record of the Quasi-Judicial Hearing.

Councilwoman Silvestri spoke regarding the project and the speed on 120th Avenue.

There was further discussion regarding the project.

Vice Mayor McGovern inquired about proportionate share.

Councilwoman Silvestri inquired about the plan for the culvert.

Vice Mayor McGovern asked Mr. Terry to discuss the sidewalk.

Mr. Terry spoke regarding the sidewalk and showed a graphic of the aerial location of the project. He spoke regarding a contribution of \$50,000.

Mr. Barnes spoke regarding the traffic light with contributions shared between the school district and the Village of Wellington.

Vice Mayor McGovern asked to see the Isles access plan.

Mr. Terry showed the Access from Isles Vista Boulevard graphic.

Councilwoman Siskind stated a lot of concessions have been made and feels that this is better with all of the changes and staff has recommended approval of the project.

Vice Mayor McGovern inquired about the suggested changes.

Ms. Cohen summarized the conditions: Conditions 7A and 7B would be revised to add additional Lot 14, Condition 11 would be amended to 250, additional new condition relating to the roadway design and giving flexibility to the Village Engineer to approve no less that what is being proposed in the new proposal from tonight, additional condition incorporating speed limiting design at the entrance or exit of the community, project standards manual would be amended to add the additional landscaping requirement on the eastern south view of the property and additional landscaping associated with Lot 13.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Siskind, seconded by Vice Mayor McGovern, and passed (3-2; Councilwoman Silvestri and Councilwoman Antuña dissenting) to approve Resolution No. R2024-19 (Orange Point PUD Master Plan Amendment – Canter Project) as amended with additional revisions as stated by Ms. Cohen and Mr. Stillings.

ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S AMENDING ARTICLE 6 OF WELLINGTON'S LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, MORE SPECIFICALLY, A ZONING AMENDMENT TO MODIFY SECTION 6.2.2.G. TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE COMMUNICATIONS STANDARDS COMMERCIAL WIRELESS FACILITIES, ALLOWING PROPERTIES THAT ARE ACQUIRED BY WELLINGTON OR ACME BE INCLUDED AS PRELIMINARY APPROVED TOWER SITES, AND AMENDING THE WIRELESS COMMUNICATION TOWER MAP LOCATIONS FOR PRELIMINARY APPROVED TOWERS WITHIN WELLINGTON, AS MORE SPECIFICALLY CONTAINED HEREIN; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mr. Barnes introduced this item.

Ms. Hall read the Ordinance by title.

Damian Newell provided background information and discussed amendments and updates to the text. He referenced the proposed communication tower master plan and showed a location map regarding cell towers. The Planning, Zoning and Adjustment Board (PZAB) recommended approval at their July 17, 2024 meeting.

Public Hearing

A motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Siskind, and unanimously passed (5-0) to open the public hearing.

Public Comment:

1. Rick Christmas spoke regarding the northwest section coverage.

Mr. Stillings stated staff is looking in the area and discussed an opportunity they are working on with Wellington National.

There being further no public comments, a motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Siskind, and unanimously passed (5-0) to close the public hearing.

A motion was made by Councilwoman Siskind, seconded by Vice Mayor McGovern, and unanimously passed (5-0) to approve Ordinance No. 2024-06 (Cell Tower Zoning Text Amendment) as presented on first reading.

Ms. Hall read the Ordinance by title.

Cory Cramer stated this Ordinance that allows the Village to use the county website for electronic publication of notices and advertisements. She stated some references and other provisions of the Land Development Regulations needed to be changed.

There being no public comments, a motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Silvestri, and unanimously passed (5-0) to close the public hearing.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Siskind, and unanimously passed (5-0) to approve Ordinance No. 2024-08 (Public Notice Requirements Zoning Text Amendment) as presented on first reading.

Mayor Napoleone thanked Ms. Jariwala for the presentation.

Public Comment:

Mayor Napoleone asked if the report could be reviewed, modified, or re-prioritized.

Mr. Reinsvold replied yes and stated the report gives the Village a guideline of where to direct resources regarding grants.

Vice Mayor McGovern thanked staff, the task force and all who worked to make this happen.

A motion was made by Vice Mayor McGovern, seconded by Councilwoman Siskind, and unanimously passed (5-0) to Approve Resolution No. R2024-43 (Adoption of The Wellington Vision Zero Action Plan).

Mr. Ed De La Vega discussed and highlighted items in the agreement.

Vice Mayor McGovern commented about the Village's usage.

Mr. De La Vega responded to Council's questions.

Mayor Napoleone offered brief comments regarding the agreement.
