WHEREAS, the Wellington Council, as the governing body of the Village of Wellington, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Article VIII, Section 2 of the Florida Constitution, and Chapter 166 of the Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to adopt and amend legislation to govern the affairs of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Wellington adopted an updated Code of Ordinances in 2022 and recognized
 that periodic updates and other revisions would be necessary or beneficial to protect the health,
 safety and welfare of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Wellington believes that it is in the best interests of the community to make additional modifications to the Code of Ordinances to update certain provisions to provide for greater efficiency and to make changes necessary to comply with recent changes in Florida law; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's Council has taken the recommendations of Wellington's staff and the comments from the public into consideration as part of its review of the proposed amendments to the Code of Ordinances that are the subject of this Ordinance.

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40 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON, 41 FLORIDA THAT:

43 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Chapter 1 of the Code of Ordinances, GENERAL PROVISIONS, is 44 amended as follows:

In addition to the penalties provided in this section, any condition caused or permitted to 70 exist in violation of any of the provisions of this Code or of a Wellington ordinance shall be 71 deemed a public nuisance and may be abated by Wellington, as provided by law, and each 72 day that such condition continues shall be regarded a new and separate offense. Costs 73 associated with Wellington abatements of safety, health and/or nuisance violations shall be 74 invoiced to the property owner. Such invoices not paid within 30 days shall be forwarded to 75 the Special Magistrate to be levied as a Code Enforcement Compliance Abatement Lien. 76 Unpaid abatement liens associated with non-homesteaded properties are subject to 77 foreclosure. 78

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Sec. 2-45, Notice, is amended as follows:

156 Prior to issuing a citation, a Code Compliance Officer shall provide written notice to the person who has committed a violation of a code or ordinance and shall establish a reasonable time period 157 within which the person must correct the violation. Such time period shall be no fewer than five (5) 158 159 days and no more than 30 days. If, upon personal investigation, a Code Compliance Officer finds that the person has not corrected the violation within the time period allowed, the Code Compliance 160 Officer may issue a citation to the person who has committed the violation. A Code Compliance 161 162 Officer or Law Enforcement Officer does not have to provide the person with a reasonable time period to correct the violation prior to issuing a citation and may immediately issue a citation if a 163 repeat violation is found or if the Code Compliance Oofficer has reason to believe that the violation 164 presents a serious threat to the public health, safety, or welfare, or if the violation is irreparable or 165 irreversible. Further, an officer may immediately issue a citation for a violation that occurs on a 166 public right-of-way or on public property. 167

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Sec. 2-47, Violations and Penalties, is amended and reorganized as follows:

Upon any street or roadway, unless clearly marked by striping and/or signage to 397 permit parking; 398 399 17. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure upon a street; 400 401 18. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping, standing, or parking. 402 403 H. No person shall at any time stop, stand, park or allow to be parked a vehicle on a public or 404 private swale or easement adjacent to a paved or unpaved road or street, or across a public 405 or private sidewalk. This provision shall not apply during a garage sale, "open house", or 406 other special or social event in areas where temporary parking is permitted by the host or 407 neighbors. The foregoing exception does not apply to vacation rentals, as defined by 408 Wellington's Land Development Regulations. Further, parking violations or any other 409 violation of the vacation rental provisions of the Land Development Regulations may be 410 prosecuted as irreparable or irreversible violations. 411 412 Sec. 22-20, Unlawful Parking in Space Designated for Use by Disabled Persons; 413 Responsibility of Owner to comply with State Law, subsection A is amended as follows: 414 415 A. It is unlawful for any person to stop, stand, or park a vehicle within any marked parking 416 space specially designated for use by disabled persons provided in accordance with state 417 law or Wellington ordinance, unless such vehicle displays a disabled person parking permit 418 or license plate issued pursuant to state law, and such vehicle is transporting the person to 419 whom the permit or plate is issued. Whenever an Code Compliance Officer or Law 420 eEnforcement eOfficer finds a vehicle stopped, standing, or parked in violation of this 421 section, that officer shall: 422 423 424 1. Have the vehicle in violation removed to any lawful parking space or facility or require 425 the operator or other person in charge of the vehicle to immediately remove the vehicle from the parking space. Whenever any vehicle is removed by an Code 426 Compliance Officer or Law eEnforcement eOfficer to a lawful parking space or facility, 427 the cost of such removal and parking shall be a lien against the vehicle; and 428 429 430 2.  - 6. When removal of a vehicle is necessary in the interest of public safety because of fire, flood, storm, or other emergency reason.
