Good afternoon, Damian. Earlier this summer we discussed proposing to modify some of the site features of Lotis Wellington Phase 1. In the commercial pod, we are having a variety of issues with the approved benches, trash cans and bike racks. Please see attached for the document showing the comparison of the approved items and what we are proposing to replace them, along with the site plan of the commercial pod showing the benches, trash cans and bike rack locations. There are supply, timing and cost issues with the approved bench and trash can models and we feel that the proposed models will still contain the blue accents of the original items but also will also be more durable and easier to maintain than the delicate items that were approved. For the bike racks, we feel that a rounded bike rack will look better against the sharper lines of the buildings and will give a rounded contrast to the buildings, and they will also deter skateboarders or people from jumping/sitting on them or using them for anything other than their intended use.
