I Call to Order

Vice Chair Jacqueline Hutman called the meeting to order at 4:00 pm.

II Pledge of Allegiance

- A. [PSC-250](#) PALM BEACH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE DISTRICT 8 WELLINGTON REPORT

Lt. Humphrey greeted the committee. He shared quarterly statistics and mentioned he has a presentation from the JAM unit. He mentioned that crime trends remain relatively low, but one main concern is traffic crashes. He said that the biggest problem is the property crimes related to automobile burglaries and vehicle thefts. Lt. Humphrey said that members of the community are leaving vehicles unlocked or key fobs in the vehicle.

He stated the district has placed message boards around Wellington to remind members of the community to lock vehicles and take valuables out of the vehicles. He shared the PSA that Sheriff Bradshaw and Captain Addazio presented regarding vehicle burglaries.

In addition, the district is working on a new program in which residents can sign up to have PBSO place a sticker on the back window of their vehicles if the vehicles are being driven between certain hours of the night. This would then give PBSO probable cause to search the vehicle during those hours if it was found to be driven during that time.

Members of the committee asked questions Lt. Humphrey relating to car burglaries and break-ins being related to vehicle theft groups.

Lt. Humphrey introduced Deputy Michael Barbusio to the Committee. Deputy Barbusio is the JAM Juvenile Arrest Monitoring (JAM) Deputy for the Village of Wellington. He gave a presentation on what his duties and responsibilities are. Deputy answered questions from the committee.

B. [PSC-255](#) PALM BEACH COUNTY FIRE RESCUE REPORT

District Chief Vomero greeted the committee and went on to share the turnout times from December 12th to March 11th. During this period there was a total of 1,701 calls in Wellington. Of those calls, 75% of them were medical. There were 214 alarms, 88 vehicle accidents, 71 investigations or assists, 30 fires, 8 hazardous situations, 5 inner facility transports, 4 other call types, and 1 water-related incident. The District Chief shared that the average response time was 6 minutes 47 seconds.

C. [PSC-248](#) STAFF REPORT

Ms. Coates greeted the committee and reminded the members that the next scheduled meeting is June 12th at 4 pm in Council Chambers. She shared the new Vision Zero website and the interactive features on this webpage.

Ms. Coates shared that National Take Back Day is April 27th and that she is working on planning the Hurricane Expo which is scheduled for May 4th.

Ms. Coates reminded the Committee that their terms will end on May 31, 2024.

The committee commented on how well done the Vision Zero website is.

Christian Santa-Gonzalez introduced himself to the committee and gave a brief update on the Bicycle Initiatives Action Plan. He mentioned that the current projects in progress include a bicycle parking audit and bicycle repair stations.
