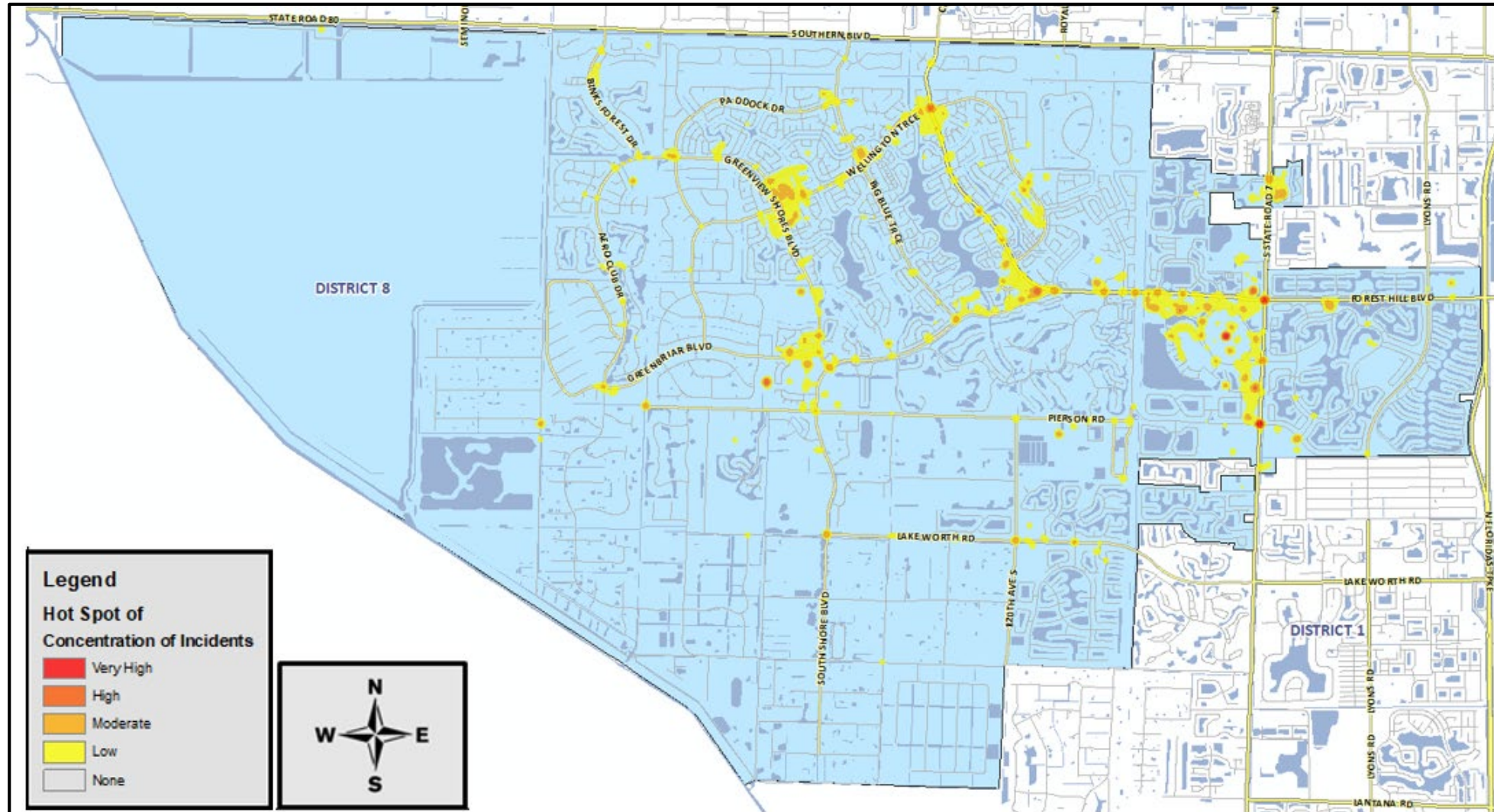

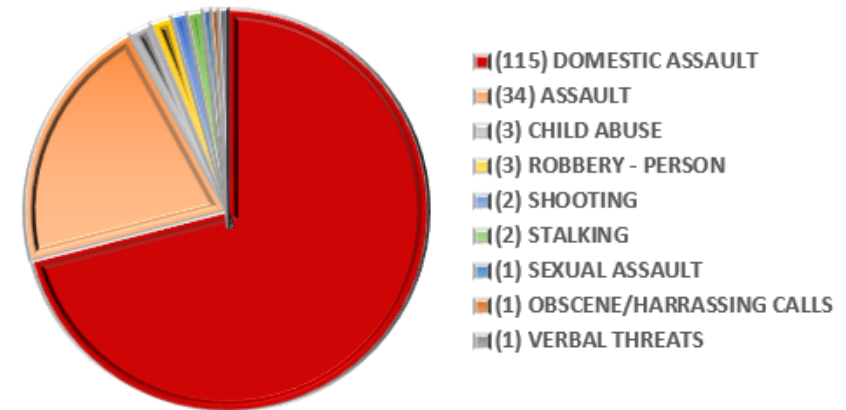

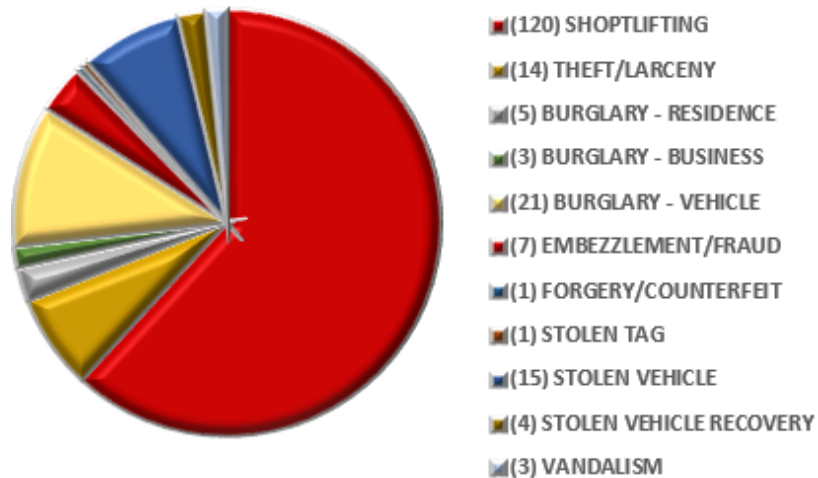

2021 Person Crime Arrests (129)



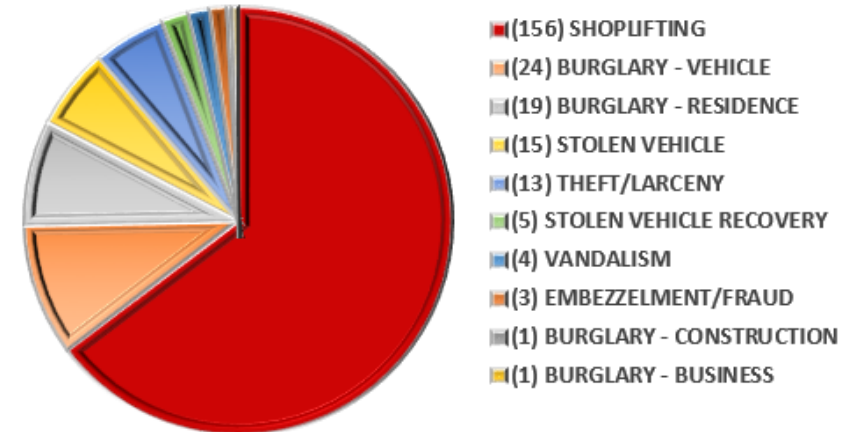
District 8 - Village of Wellington

2021 Property Crimes Arrests (194)



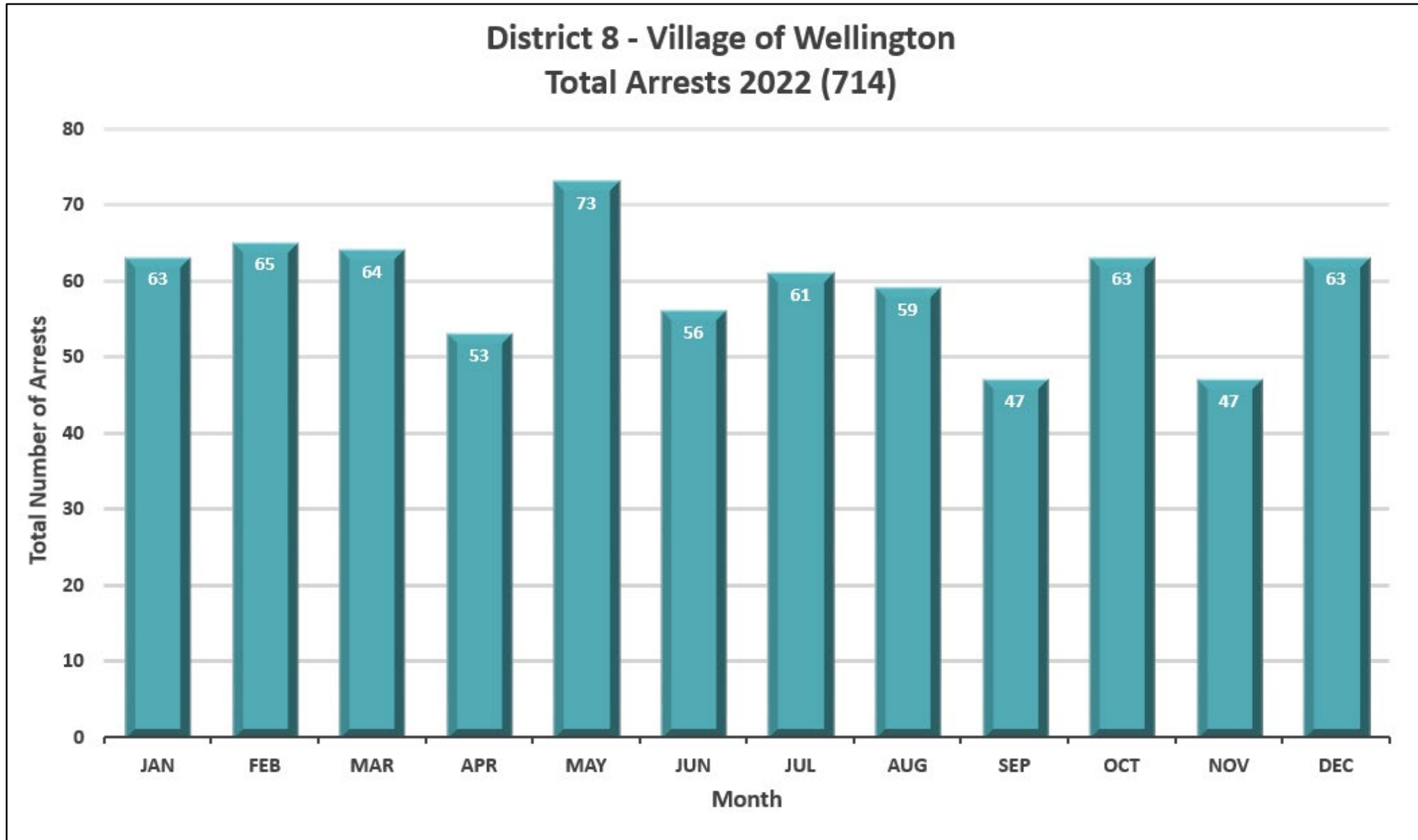

2022 Property Crime Arrests (241)



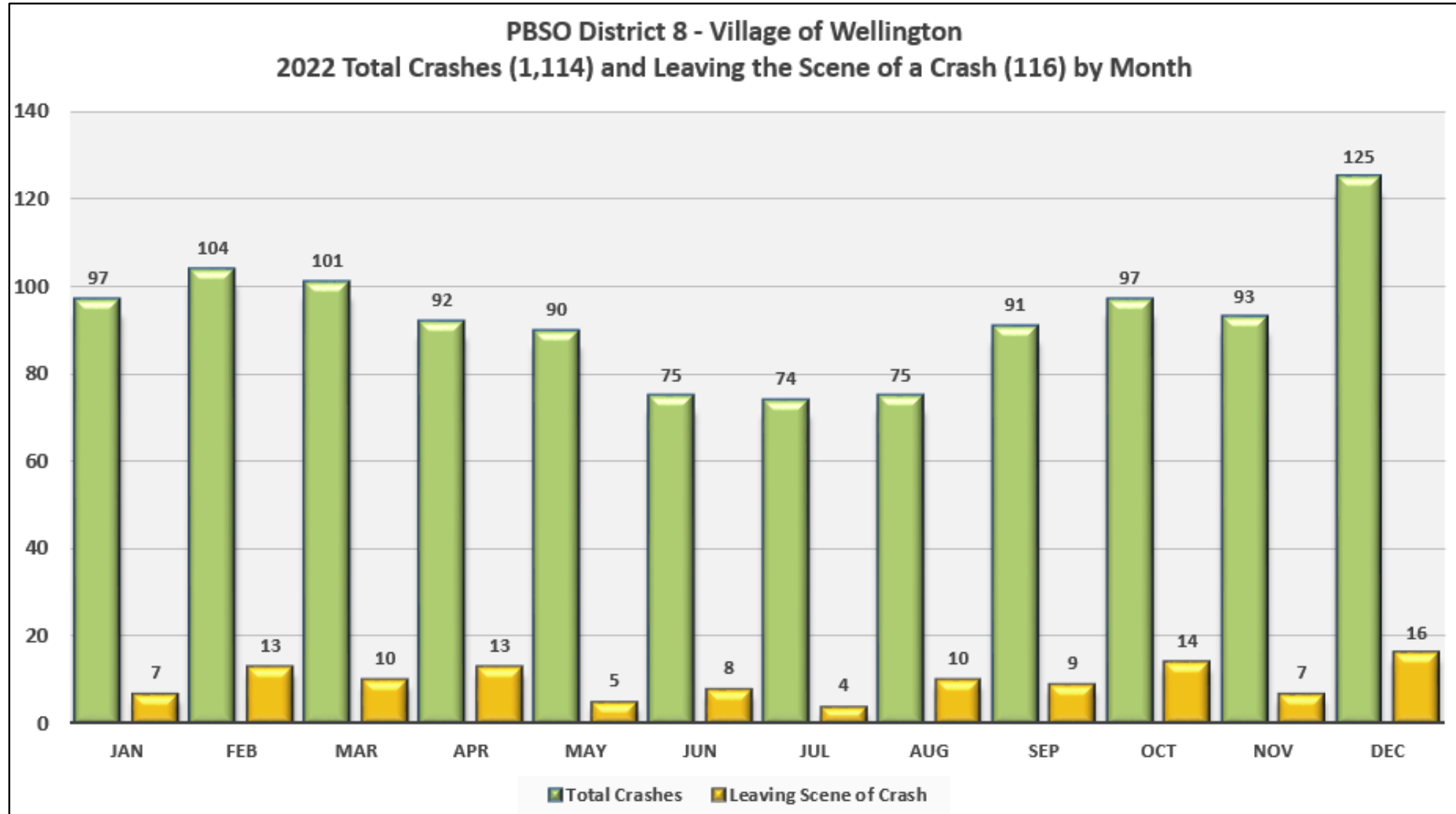

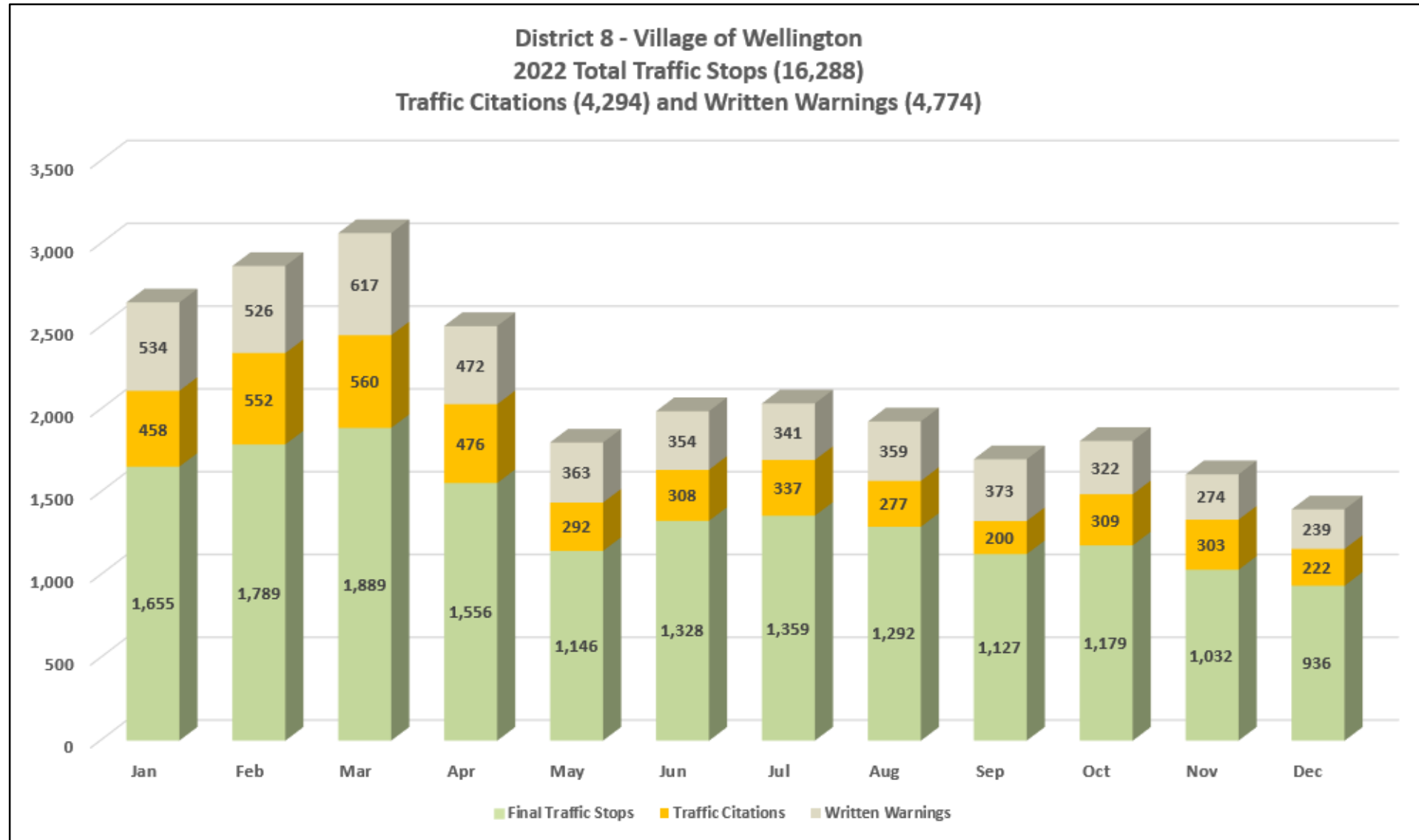

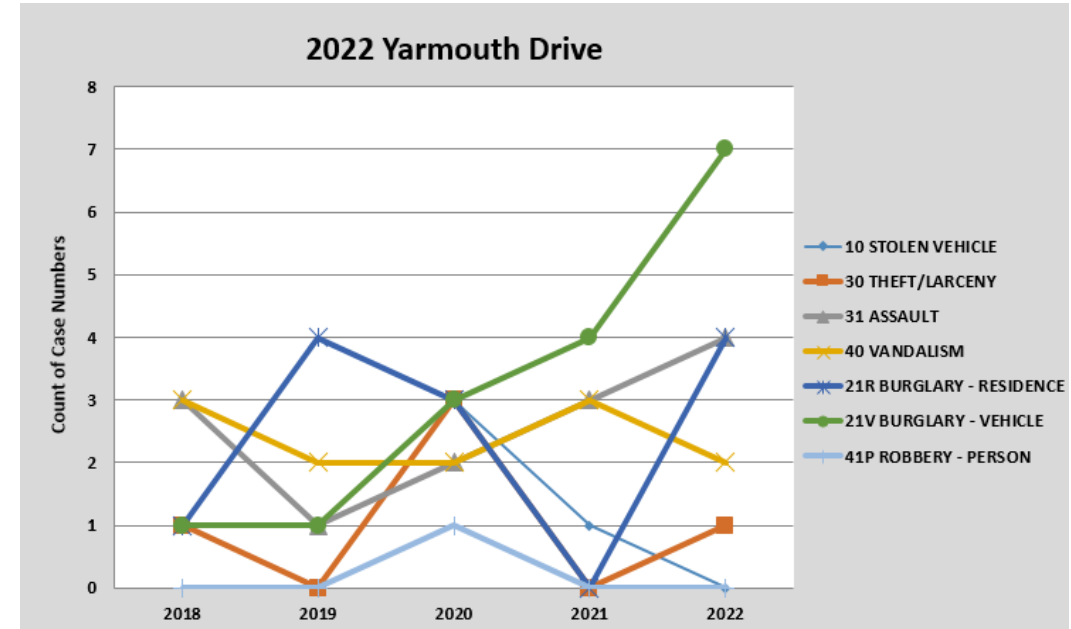
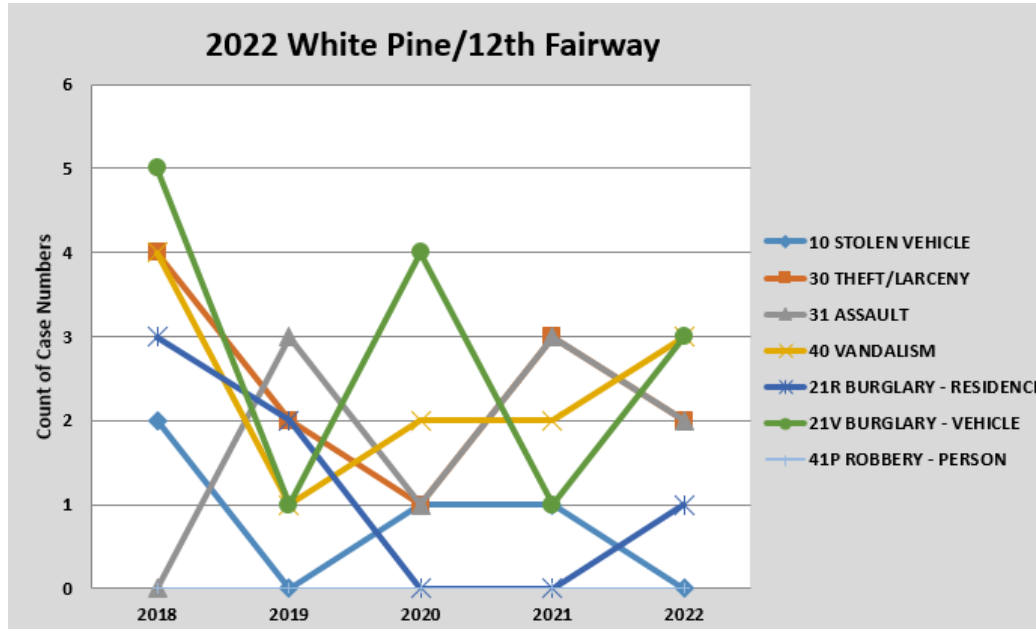
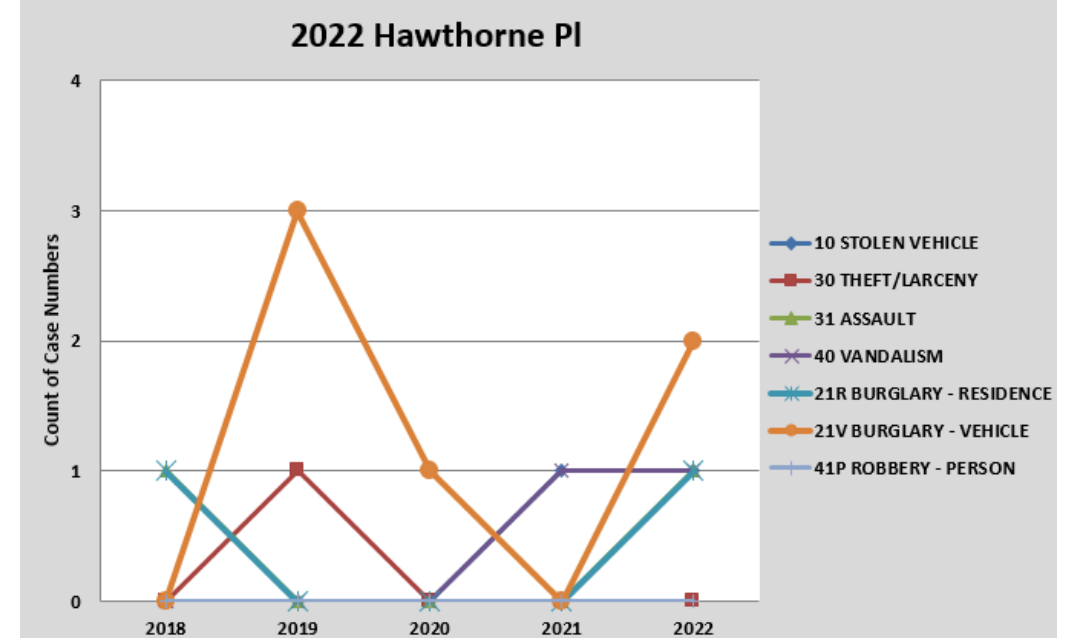
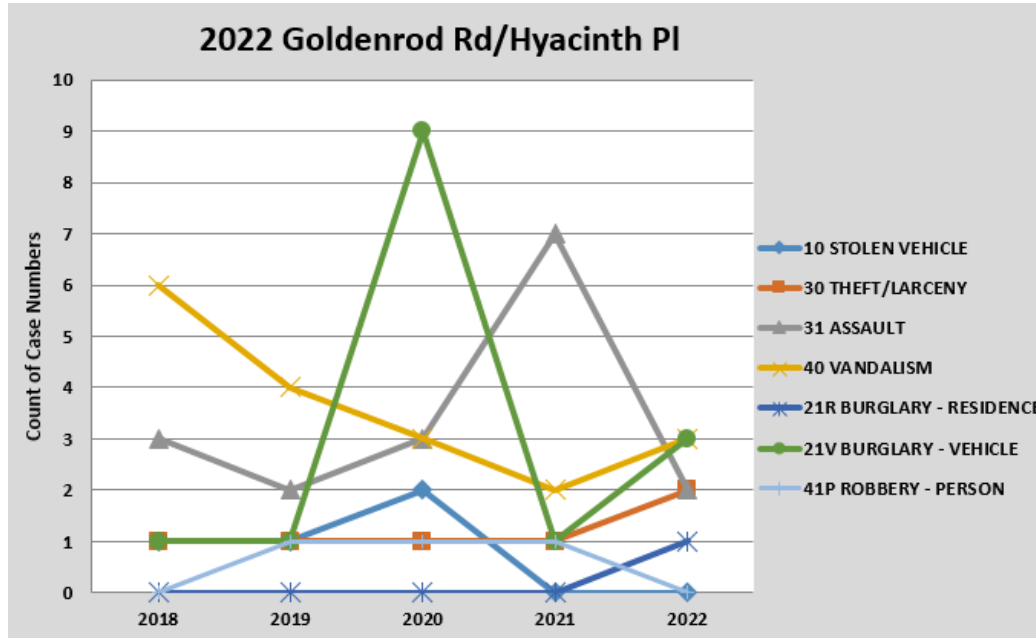
- **2022 Commercial Vehicle Enforcement:**

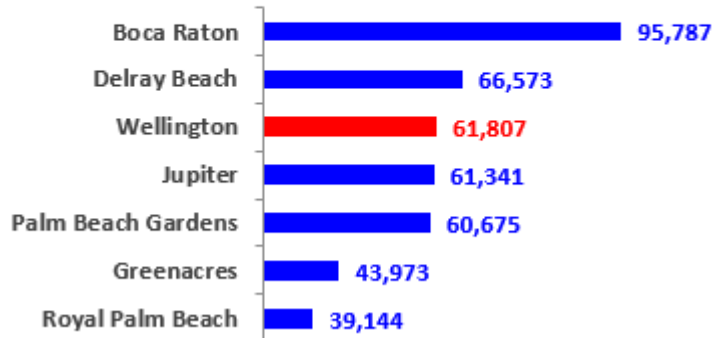

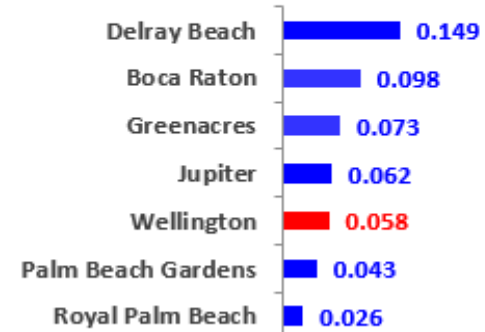

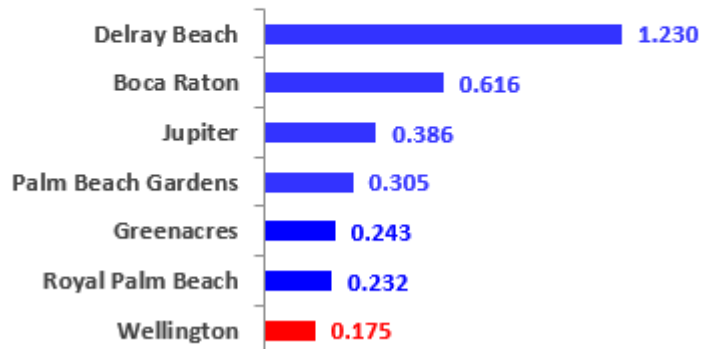
2022 Population



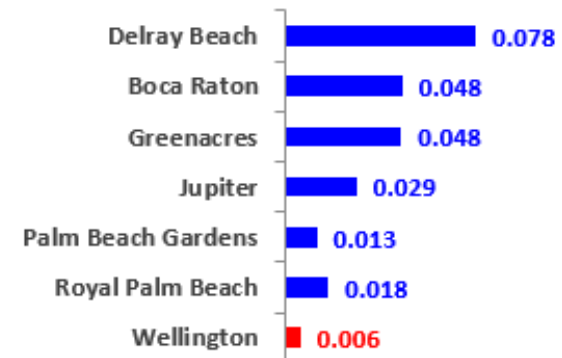
2022 Residential Burglaries Per 100 Residents



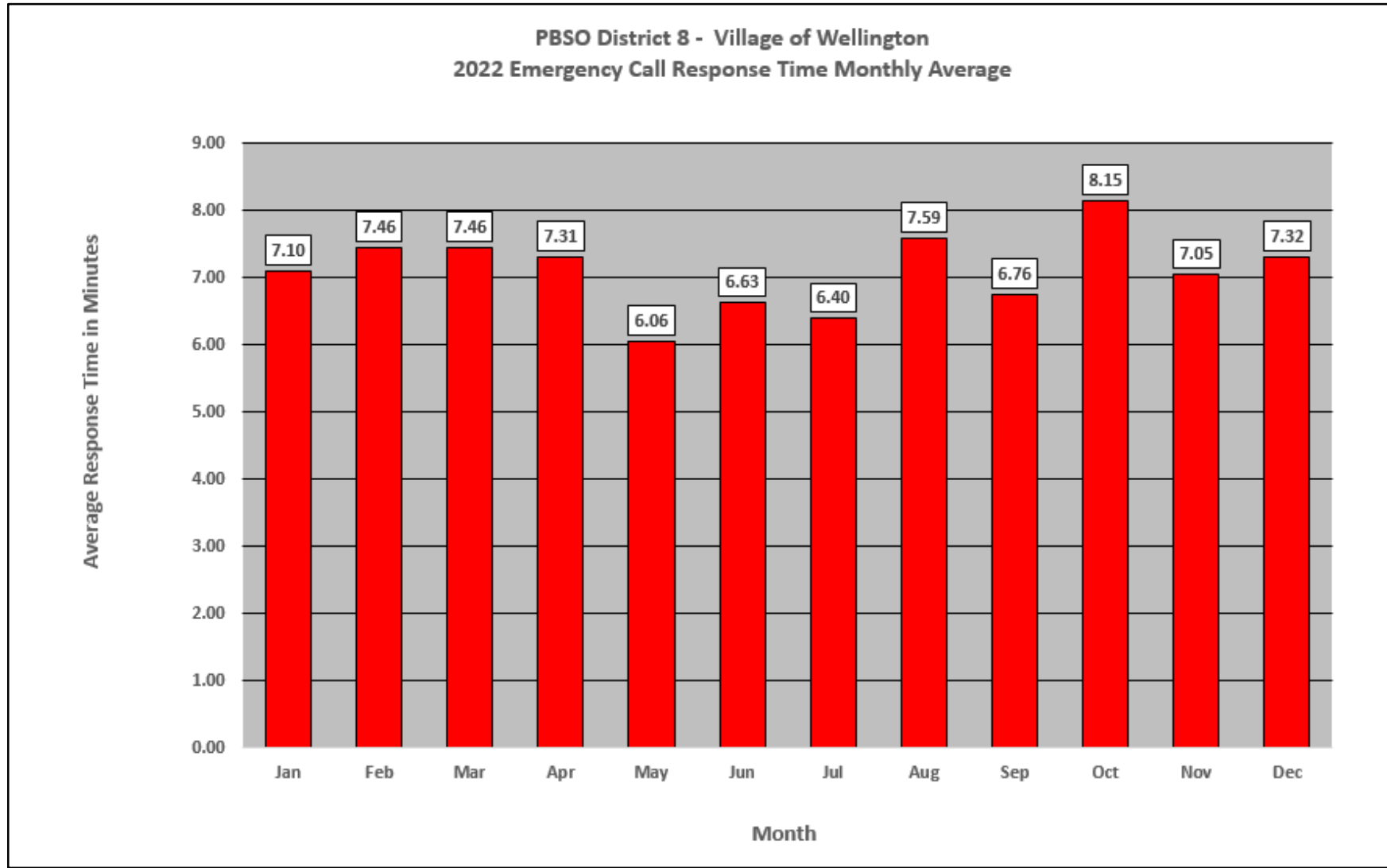
2022 Vehicle Burglaries Per 100 Residents

11. Response Times to Emergency Calls



Response Times for Priority 1 (Emergency) Calls were generated by the Crime View Desktop Application.
Priority 1 Calls include, but are not limited to, crimes that are in-progress, have just occurred or require immediate response.
Average Response Time in 2022 decreased to 7.12 minutes from 7.52 minutes in 2021, a 5% decrease.

12. Action Plans, Operations, and Special Initiatives

Annual Holiday Action Plan:

22068050 – District 8 Road Patrol, along with PBSO K9 and Aviation, responded to the area of Wellington Trace and Forest Hill Boulevard after receiving an alert of a stolen red Alfa Romeo. Deputies followed the vehicle to Forest Hill Boulevard and Military Trail in District 1 where the two subjects crashed the vehicle and fled on foot. The subjects were located and taken into custody without further incident.

 - **Initial Traffic Stops increased 24% from 2021 (13,170) to 2022 (16,288).**
 - **Crashes increased .49% from 2021 (1,225) to 2022 (1,231).**
 - **The CR per 100 residents increased slightly by 0.40% from a 2021 CR (1.983) to a 2022 CR (1.991)**
 - **PBSO easily surpassed the objective to “maintain a CR of less than 3.0”.**
