2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 9C OF WELLINGTON'S MUNICIPAL CHARTER RELATING TO CANDIDATE QUALIFYING DATES BY AMENDING SECTION 9, SUBSECTION C, "QUALIFYING FOR OFFICE" TO MOVE THE QUALIFYING PERIOD TO A TWO WEEK PERIOD IN NOVEMBER PRIOR TO THE MARCH GENERAL ELECTION; PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF THE PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENT TO THE ELECTORS OF WELLINGTON AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON MARCH 10, 2026; PROVIDING FOR FILING WITH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF STATE; PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
18	TROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
19	WHEREAS, Section 166.031, Florida Statutes, provides that the governing body of a
20	municipality may, by ordinance, submit to the electors of the municipality a proposed
21 22	amendment to the municipality's charter; and
22	WHEREAS, the Charter currently provides that residents wishing to qualify to become
24	a candidate for a Village elective office must qualify with the Clerk no sooner than noon on
25	the last Tuesday in January and not later than noon on the second Tuesday in February of
26	the year in which the election is to be held; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, Wellington's municipal elections are held during the uniform municipal
29 30	elections period, which occurs on the second Tuesday in March of each election year; and
31	WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections requires at least 95 days
32	prior to an election to have sufficient time to prepare, print, and test municipal ballots and to
33	convert such ballots into an accessible format for persons with disabilities and has therefore
34	requested that municipalities ensure that their candidate qualifying periods be moved to
35	accommodate such time period; and
36	WITERAS Wellington's Council deems it processory and eduisable for the veters of
37	WHEREAS, Wellington's Council deems it necessary and advisable for the voters of
38 39	Wellington to consider amending the charter of the Village of Wellington to move the qualifying period to a two week period during November of the year prior to the March
39 40	municipal elections; and

42	WHEREAS, moving the qualifying period to November avoids conflict with various Fall
43	and Winter holidays and promotes participation by those who may seek to become
44	candidates.

46	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE

VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA:

3 SECTION 1. Section 9, Subsection C. "Qualifying for Office" is hereby proposed to be 4 amended to read as follows: 5 6 C. Qualifying for office. Any resident of the Village who wishes to become 7 a candidate for a Village elective office shall qualify with the Village Clerk 8 no sooner than noon on the first last Tuesday in January November nor 9 later than noon on the third second Tuesday in November February of 10 the year prior to in which the election is to be held. 11 12 SECTION 2. The charter amendment proposed by this ordinance shall be submitted 13 to the electors of the Village of Wellington at the election to be held on March 10, 2026 and shall be deemed adopted upon the favorable vote of a majority of the electors voting at that 14 time upon the following question: 15 16 17 VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON REFRENDUM QUESTION NO. 1 18 19 Qualifying for Office 20 21 **BALLOT SUMMARY:** Wellington's Charter provides that any resident wishing 22 to become a candidate for a Village elective office shall qualify with the Village 23 Clerk during a two week period from late January to early February. The 24 Supervisor of Elections has requested municipalities submit ballots at least 95 25 days prior to an election to allow sufficient time to prepare, print and test the 26 ballots. The proposed amendment moves the gualifying period to a two week 27 period in November. 28 29 BALLOT QUESTION: Shall the qualifying period for Village elective offices 30 be moved to November? 31 32 Yes 33 34 No 35 36 **SECTION 3.** In the event of adoption by the electorate as provided herein, Wellington's Clerk shall forthwith incorporate the amendment into Wellington's charter by 37 38 preparing a true copy of section 9C as amended, and shall file the revised section with the 39 Florida Department of State, at which time the revised section shall take effect. 40 41 **SECTION 4.** Wellington's Clerk shall cause this ordinance to be published once a 42 week for four consecutive weeks immediately prior to the election on March 10, 2026. 43 44 **SECTION 5.** Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this 45 Ordinance conflict with any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of any prior Wellington 46 Ordinance, Resolution, or Municipal Code provision; then in that event the provisions of this
