13 14 15	WHEREAS, a review of the terms and duties of Board memberships has led to Wellington's Council concluding that seven regular board or committee members works best.

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45 <u>SECTION 3</u>. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance
 46 conflict with any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of any prior Wellington Ordinance,
 47 Resolution, or municipal Code provision, then in that event the provisions of this Ordinance
 48 shall prevail to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 4: Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phase of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole as a whole or any portion or part thereof, other than the part so declared to be invalid.

SECTION 5: Specific authority is hereby granted to codify this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption of the Council of Wellington following second reading.
