




District 8 - Village of Wellington 2016 Person Crime Arrests (128)

District 8 - Village of Wellington 2016 Property Crime Arrests (381)




District 8 - Village of Wellington 2017 Property Crime Arrests (470)










The drop in statistics during September and October was due to storm related responsibilities and assignments.




## 2017 Commercial Vehicle Enforcement:


- Ensures commercial vehicle compliance with Village permits and ordinances.

- Makes drivers more attentive to maintaining their vehicles in proper working condition.












# 11. Response Times to Emergency Calls

## 12. Number and Type of Special/Additional Enforcement

### Annual Holiday Action Plan:

Implemented a "Holiday Action Plan" for the 2017-2018 holiday shopping season, November 25th, 2017 (Black Friday) through December 26<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The focus of the plan was to prevent robberies, thefts, auto thefts, vehicle burglaries, and retail theft at the Mall at Wellington Green. The mall is Wellington's premier shopping venue and safety is of paramount importance to PBSO. There was one strong arm robbery reported and both suspects were apprehended and arrested the same day.

### Operations:


• During 2017, District personnel participated in a variety of suppression operations, targeting various criminal activities (Robbery, Burglary, Vehicle Thefts, Speeding, DUI, underage liquor sales, etc.). These operations were, in no specific order; Operation Bump, Operation Deadbolt, Operation Safe School Zones, Operation Spring Cleanup, Operation Vigilance, Operation Vigilant Guardian and Operation Wild Stallion.

## 14. Goals: Action Plans

## 2018 Action Plans

- Burglary and Theft Crimes:
  - Maintain Burglary and Theft crimes less than 1,000 cases in 2018.
  - Clear at least 10% of burglaries by arrest.
- Traffic Safety:
  - Maintain a crash rate of less then 3.0 crashes per 100 residents in 2018.

Burglary and Theft crimes are the combined total number of 2017 Burglary, Shoplifting and Theft/Larceny cases.

# 15. Goal - Burglary and Theft

### Performance Goals:

- Maintain Burglary and Theft crimes less than 1,000 cases in 2018.
- Clear at least 10% of burglaries by arrest.

## Result:

- Burglary and Theft crimes increased 4.74% in 2017 (928) versus 2016 (886).
- Of the 420 burglaries in 2017, 23.80% were cleared by arrest (100).
- Residential Burglary decreased by 40.18% in 2017 (64) versus 2016 (107).

## 16. Goal - Traffic Issues

## Performance Goal:

Maintain a Crash Rate (CR) of less then 3.0 crashes per 100
 Village Residents.

### Result:

- Crashes decreased 1.87% in 2017 (1,523) versus 2016 (1,552).
- Per 100 residents, the 2017 CR was 2.456 versus 2.586 in 2016.
- The 2017 CR decreased 5.02% from the 2016 CR.
- Original Traffic Stops increased 18.75% in 2017 (16,369) versus 2016 (13,785).

Village Residents assumes a Village of Wellington population of 62,000 in 2017 and 60,000 in 2016.
