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A RESOLUTION OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL ESTABLISHING RATES, FEES AND CHARGES WHICH THE VILLAGE MAY ASSESS ITS CUSTOMERS FOR POTABLE WATER AND WASTEWATER SERVICE AND RELATED MISCELLANEOUS UTILITY SERVICES; THE MANNER IN WHICH THOSE AMOUNTS MAY BE ASSESSED AND AUTOMATICALLY ADJUSTED; THE MANNER AND AMOUNTS IN WHICH CUSTOMER DEPOSITS MAY BE ASSESSED FOR SUCH SERVICES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Wellington's potable water and wastewater utility systems (collectively, the "Utility System") include those operations that are supported entirely by the revenues collected from the customers of the Utility System; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's Council seeks to establish uniform and non-discriminatory utility rates, fees, and charges for the proper administration of the Utility System; and

WHEREAS, an independent consultant has been retained by Wellington to develop revenue projections for fiscal years 2018-2019 through 2022-2023 and accompanying rates, fees and charges necessary to operate and maintain the Utility System and to fund the capital improvement program; and

WHEREAS, Wellington regulations require that each rate structure adopted by Wellington for the Utility System be established at an advertised public hearing via a formal resolution of Wellington's Council; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Florida Statute 180.136, Wellington has notified its utility customers, through its utility billing process, of the date, time and place of the meeting of Wellington's Council at which an increase in Wellington's utility rates, fees, and charges will be considered; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's Council has concluded a public hearing on this date to consider the proposed rates, fees and charges and to receive public comments concerning same; and

WHEREAS, Wellington's Council finds that the rate schedule included in Exhibit "A" is reasonable and adequate to meet the stated goals of Wellington.

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SECTION 1. INTRODUCTION

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3 1.1 PURPOSE

- 4 The purpose of this Rate Resolution is to establish uniform and nondiscriminatory utility rates,
- 5 fees and charges for the proper administration of the Village of Wellington Water and
- 6 Wastewater Systems.

7 1.2 VALIDITY

- 8 The rates, fees and charges as well as related definitions specified herein supersede and replace
- 9 any prior rates, fees and charges governing the provision of water and wastewater utility service
- unless such prior specification is protected by valid agreement or otherwise protected by law or
- action of the Village Council. If a portion of this document is declared unconstitutional or void
- 12 for any reason by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall in no way affect the
- validity of the remaining portions.

14 1.3 APPLICATION OF CURRENT LAWS

- 15 The Village Utility System will abide by and adhere to all current Federal, State and local laws,
- rules and regulations as applicable.

17 1.4 PERPETUITY OF SERVICE

- 18 Upon Service Initiation, the Customer will be billed and is obligated to pay Monthly Base
- 19 Facility Rates for service availability regardless of whether consumption has occurred. Monthly
- 20 Base Facility Rates address the ongoing expenses required to keep service available to
- 21 customers. Accordingly, upon discontinuance of service (excluding permanent, physical
- disconnection) to a property, Monthly Base Facility Rates will continue to accrue. Failure to pay
- 23 these fees within sixty (60) days may result in a Claim of Lien being filed on the Property in
- 24 accordance with the provisions of Chapter 159, Florida Statutes. The Village will endeavor to
- 25 provide service in perpetuity if the Customer adheres to the rules stated herein and as may be
- revised from time to time and maintains his billing account in a current paid status.

27 1.5 EMERGENCY AUTHORITY TO WAIVE RATES, FEES and CHARGES

- 28 The Utility Director may waive Monthly Base Facility Rates for up to twelve (12) months for
- 29 homes and businesses that have been condemned by the Palm Beach County Health Department
- or any other governmental entity as the result of such emergency condition. In such cases, the
- 31 Utility shall remove the meter at no charge to the Customer, and no Capacity Charges or re-
- 32 installation fees will be charged by the Utility when service is restored provided that the restored
- 33 service is the same as that previously disconnected. The waiver of such Monthly Base Facility
- 24 Device is the state of the provincial of the state of
- Rates shall apply only to the originally affected property owner, and billing for Monthly Base
- 35 Facility Rates shall be resumed if the property is sold or transferred to another owner.

36 1.6 SERVICE AREA

37 The Utility may provide potable water and wastewater service to all areas within the Village

1 Utility Service Boundary except for those areas defined in written agreements.

2 1.7 DEFINITIONS

- 3 1.7.1 Capacity Charge
- 4 The fee designed to recover the capital cost of system capacity which has been or will be
- 5 constructed in anticipation of future utility service requests.
- 6 1.7.2 Commercial Customer
- 7 Commercial Customers include all utility connections that are not a Residential Customer and
- 8 any secondary service connections that are in addition to the service connection that serves a
- 9 Customer's Dwelling Unit. Also included are connections to government facilities, irrigation
- 10 system connections, motels, hotels, and hospitals. The Commercial Customer class is separated
- into subcategories by meter size with Monthly Base Facility Rates determined by meter size.
- 12 1.7.3 Customer
- 13 Any person, Dwelling Unit, agent, Property Owner, developer, user, company, municipal
- 14 corporation, political subdivision, homeowners' association, or other entity which accepts or
- 15 receives Potable Water or Wastewater services, or which benefits directly from utility services
- rendered by the Village Utility System.
- 17 1.7.4 Director
- 18 The Director of the Village Utility System or his/her duly authorized representative.
- 19 1.7.5 Dwelling Unit
- 20 A single residential unit designated or intended for one-family occupancy (a household of one or
- 21 more persons), including, but not limited to, one single-family house, one-half of a duplex, one
- apartment, or one condominium.
- 23 1.7.6 Fire Line
- 24 A dedicated Potable Water service line utilized to provide water for fire suppression systems.
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6 (1) Residential Fire Lines:

(a) Single Meter Residential fire lines are defined further in NFPA 13d. The Fire Marshall non-monitored system is connected to the Village's Potable Water System on the customer side of the primary potable water meter serving a dwelling unit. Single meter residential homes which would normally qualify for a 5/8" meter with a NFPA 13d fire sprinkler system shall require a 1-inch meter but will be charged Capacity Charges and monthly Base Facility Rates in accordance with the rates established for a 5/8-inch

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(b) Master Meter Residential fire lines are defined further in NFPR 13r. The Fire Marshall monitored system serving master metered residential units is connected to the Village 's Potable Water System through a separate tie-in and properly sized, approved, testable above ground backflow prevention device.

- 4 1.7.7 Grease Trap
- 5 A Village-approved device designed and installed to separate and retain floatable, deleterious,
- 6 hazardous, and/or undesirable matter generated by food processing facilities from Wastewater or
- 7 liquid wastes, prior to discharges into the Village Wastewater Collection System.
- 8 1.7.8 Monthly Base Facility Rate
- 9 A fee paid monthly by all Customers which addresses the Customer's share of the Utility's fixed
- and non-variable costs incurred to ensure that service is continuously available.
- 11 1.7.9 Potable Water
- Water for human consumption which meets Federal, State, and County standards.
- 13 1.7.10 Potable Water System
- 14 Facilities for the supply, treatment, transmission and distribution of potable water.
- 15 1.7.11 Property Owner
- 16 The person who is vested in the ownership, dominion, or title of real property as recorded in the
- 17 Public Records of Palm Beach County.
- 18 1.7.12 Residential Connection
- 19 For the purposes herein, there shall be two classes of residential connections: Single Meter
- 20 Residential and Master Meter Residential.
- 21
- 22 (1) Single Meter Residential: Individually metered Dwelling Units.
- 23 (2) Master Meter Residential: Master-metered Dwelling Units which include apartment
- buildings, condominiums, duplexes, triplexes, fourplexes, and any other Dwelling Units that
- share one or more common walls, roofs, and/or floors
- 26 1.7.13 Usage Charge
- Fees paid monthly by all Customers based on the volume of metered water consumption and
- 28 which address the Customer's share of the Utility's variable costs incurred to ensure that service
- is continuously available.
- 30 1.7.14 Village Potable Water System
- 31 All facilities utilized for the provision of water services, including but not limited to supplying,
- 32 treating, and distributing water to Customers which are outlined by the Village of Wellington.
- 33 1.7.15 Village Utility Service Boundary
- 34 The geographical area wherein the Village Utility System provides service, as it may change
- 35 from time to time.
- 36 1.7.16 Village Utility System
- 37 All facilities utilized in the provision of water or wastewater services to Customers which are
- 38 owned by the Village of Wellington.
- 39 1.7.17 Village Wastewater System
- 40 The structures, equipment, and processes required to collect, carry away, and treat domestic,

- 1 industrial, commercial, medical, holding tank and other wastes and dispose of the effluent. Any
- 2 facility which discharges waste, or which can reasonably be expected to be a source of water
- 3 pollution and includes the Wastewater Collection System and the Wastewater Treatment Plant.
- 4 1.7.18 Wastewater
- 5 Liquid and water-carried industrial, domestic, medical, food, superfluous solid, gaseous material,
- 6 holding tank or other wastes from residential dwellings, commercial establishments and/or
- 7 manufacturing facilities, whether treated or untreated, which are discharged into the Village's
- 8 Wastewater System.

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10 SECTION 2. SERVICE INITIATION CHARGES

2.1 WATER CAPACITY CHARGES

Capacity Charges for the connection to the Potable Water System shall be assessed in accordance with the following table. Capacity Charges are payable upon issuance of a building permit, or in accordance with a Utility Service Agreement.

4.2 FIRE SERVICE

Monthly Base Facility Rates pertaining to privately owned fire-protection systems and equipment connected to the Village Potable Water System shall be assessed monthly in accordance with the following table based on the size of the service line connecting the private system to the Village's Potable Water System. All potable water used for fire protection purposes that is documented to the Village Utility Director by the Fire Marshall or by a certified hydrant-testing agency shall be assessed at the then-current lowest block Usage Charge. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in accordance with Section 633.208, Florida Statutes, the Village will not charge a Capacity Charge for a separate water connection for a single family house or duplex fire sprinkler system if capacity is hydraulically available at the property line, provided that the Customer so notifies the Village prior to connection. In addition, the Village will not charge a higher monthly Base Facility Rate to a one or two family Dwelling that requires a larger water meter solely due to the installation of fire sprinklers above that which would otherwise be necessary to serve the Dwelling Unit(s); however, the Village may charge a higher Meter Installation Fee for the larger meter if there is, and to the extent of, the actual cost differential.

- The Customer is responsible for maintenance and repair of (i) all water facilities downstream of the Point of Service and (ii) all wastewater facilities upstream of the Point of Service.
