Scarlet Sage (tropical sage, blood sage)

Salvia coccinea

BF, BD. Hummingbird nectar, Painted Bunting eats seeds

Salvia lyrata

Attracts hummingbirds, butterflies and bees.

Bald Cypress

Taxodium distichum

BD, BF. Attracts seed-eating birds. Valuable as roosting and nesting areas for colonial wading birds. Larval host for baldcypress sphinx (*Isoparce cupressi*) moth.
