January

The Village kicks off its 25th in January with the grand re-opening of the newly renovated Essex Park (located at 1250 Essex Drive). Wellington's Council will join residents for a special ribbon-cutting ceremony and will highlight park improvements, including lighting, sidewalks, and an observation deck, as well as celebrate the importance of Wellington's many community parks.

February

Wellington Classic Brew Fest returns to Wellington's Town Center on Saturday, February 8, 2020, from 2:00 PM – 6:00 PM. What better way for guests, 21 and over, to raise their glasses and celebrate the Village. This event will feature an array of beer and hard ciders from Florida and beyond, accompanied by an assortment of food trucks and other craft beer-centric games, entertainment, and live music.
