## 1 **ORDINANCE NO. 2021-08** 2 3 AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL 4 **AMENDING** THE DATE FOR THE CANDIDATE 5 QUALIFYING PERIOD FOR WELLINGTON'S 6 MUNICIPAL ELECTION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE 7 DATE. 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Wellington's Charter provides that the regular Village elections are to be held on the second Tuesday in March of each election year and any required runoff is 11 12 to be held on the fourth Tuesday in March; and 13 14 WHEREAS, Wellington's Charter further provides that the qualifying period shall 15 be no sooner than noon on the last Tuesday in January nor later than noon on the second 16 Tuesday in February of the year in which the election is to be held; and 17 18 WHEREAS, Section 100.3605(2), Florida Statutes, provides that the governing 19 body of a municipality may, by ordinance, change the dates for qualifying and for the 20 election of members of the governing body of the municipality and provide for the orderly 21 transition of office resulting from such date changes; and 22 WHEREAS, Palm Beach County's Supervisor of Elections has requested that 23 24 Palm Beach County municipalities with elections scheduled to be held in March, 2022 25 modify their qualifying periods in order to allow time for the Supervisor of Elections to 26 program the elections software, prepare the ballots and mail overseas ballots. 27 28 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE 29 VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA: 30 31 **SECTION 1:** The Village of Wellington hereby amends its 2022 municipal election 32 qualifying period as follows: 33 34 Qualifying periods for candidates for the March 8, 2022 election will be from 35 noon on November 2, 2021 to noon on November 16, 2021. 36 37 **SECTION 2.** The date of Wellington's municipal election for 2022, and any runoff 38 required, will remain unchanged. 39 40 **SECTION 3.** Nothing herein is intended to create a permanent change to the 41 Village Charter. Following the March 8, 2022 election, and any subsequent runoff, 42 Wellington's qualifying period for municipal elections shall thereafter comply with its 43 Charter. 44 45 **SECTION 4.** Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this

Ordinance conflict with any section, paragraph, clause or phrase of any prior Wellington
