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3	AN ORDINANCE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA'S COUNCIL AMENDING
4	THE WELLINGTON LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS, MORE
5	SPECIFICALLY, A ZONING TEXT AMENDMENT TO MODIFY SECTION
6	6.4.1.A.5 OF ARTICLE 6 TO ESTABLISH A CONSISTENT
7	APPEARANCE OF HEDGES AND FENCES, AS CONTAINED HEREIN;
8	PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY
9	CLAUSE; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
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11	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council, as the governing body, pursuant to the authority vested
12	in Chapter 163, Chapter 166 and Chapter 177, Florida Statutes, is authorized and empowered to
13	consider changes to its Land Development Regulations (LDR); and
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15	WHEREAS, on January 13, 2020, Wellington's Council adopted the new LDR in its entirety;
16	and
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18	WHEREAS, maintaining a consistent appearance of privately owned hedges and fences
19	along thoroughfares has been a continuous challenge for the community for decades; and
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21	WHEREAS, improving consistency and creating aesthetic uniformity along Wellington's
22	thoroughfares and throughout the Village is vital to ensure the health, safety, welfare and overall
23	quality of life for Wellington; and
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25	WHEREAS, the proposed text amendment to section 6.4.1.A.5 of the Land Development
26	Regulations is consistent with the LDR and Wellington's Comprehensive Plan; and
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28	WHEREAS, the Architectural Review Board, after notice on August 18, 2021, has reviewed
29	the proposed ordinance and made a recommendation for approval with a unanimous vote (5-0);

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32	WHEREAS, the Planning, Zoning and Adjustment Board, acting as the Local Planning
33	Agency, after notice and public hearing on September 8, 2021, has reviewed the proposed
34	ordinance and made a recommendation for approval with a unanimous vote (6-0); and
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36	WHEREAS, the Wellington Council has taken the recommendations from the Local Planning
37	Agency, Wellington staff, and comments from the public into consideration as part of the review of
38	the proposed amendment to Article 6.4.1.A.5 of the Land Development Regulations that are the
39	subject of this ordinance.
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41	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA
