In addition, Mr. Rodriguez also introduced Vivian Green, Instructional Superintendent and Ed Tierney, Secondary Instructional Superintendent who were present. He also recognized and thanked the Education Committee. Mr. Rodriguez called the principals of the Wellington schools up to the front to receive their checks.

Council distributed the grant checks to the school principals.
