1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Gerwig called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m.

Council Members in Attendance: Anne Gerwig, Mayor; John McGovern, Vice Mayor; Michael Drahos, Councilman and Tanya Siskind, Councilwoman.

Councilmember Absent: Michael Napoleone, Councilman.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Gerwig led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. REVIEW OF COUNCIL AGENDA

Mr. Barnes introduced the agenda for the September 13, 2021, Regular Council Meeting for review. He said that there were no Presentations or Proclamations.

AUTHORIZATION TO EXECUTE A GUARANTEED MAXIMUM PRICE (GMP) AMENDMENT FOR THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT (WTP) WELL VARIABLE FREQUENCY DRIVE (VFD) RETROFIT PROJECT

Mr. Barnes introduced the item. He said that this is the Authorization to Execute a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) Amendment to Wharton-Smith, Inc. for the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) Well Variable Frequency Drive (VFD) Project at a Cost of \$1,723,533.00.

Ms. LaRocque explained the item. She answered the Council's questions on price increase of the wells.

Mr. Barnes introduced the item. He explained that this item will have to be moved to the Regular Agenda. He said that this is the Authorization to Negotiate Contracts with Multiple Firms for: 1) Water and Wastewater Treatment Engineering; 2) Utility General Civil, Water Distribution and Storage, and Wastewater Collection Engineering; 3) Civil Engineering; 4) Traffic Engineering; and Related Consulting Services.

Mayor Gerwig mentioned that she will be recusing herself from this item

as her company works with at least two of the firms and will fill out the responsive form.

Mr. De La Vega explained the item. He answered the questions from Council regarding the negotiations.

Mr. Barnes stated that this item will become item 8A on the regular agenda.

AUTHORIZATION TO AWARD A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE AND DELIVERY OF RAPID FLASHING BEACONS AND DUAL BEACON FLASHERS

Mr. Barnes introduced the item. He said that this is the Authorization to Award a Contract to K & K Systems, Inc., for the Purchase and Delivery of Rapid Flashing Beacons and Dual Beacon Flashers, in the amount of \$113,509.48.

Mr. De La Vega explained the item.

Mr. Barnes answered questions from Council regarding locations.

AUTHORIZATION TO RENEW A CONTRACT TO PROVIDE PROPERTY AND CASUALTY INSURANCE SERVICES

Mr. Barnes introduced the item. He said that this is the Authorization to Renew an Existing Agreement with Florida Municipal Insurance Trust (Florida League of Cities) to provide General Liability, Property, Casualty, and Workers Compensation Insurance at an estimated annual cost of \$1,225,645. He said that this item would also have to moved to the Regular Agenda as Item 8B.

Mayor Gerwig mentioned that she serves on that particular board and needs to recuse herself from this item as well.

Mr. De La Vega explained the item. He responded to questions from Council regarding the 10% increase as well as a few other questions.
