**EXPLANATION:** To amend Section 6.5.19.I.4.c of Wellington's Land Development Regulations (LDRs) providing alternative design standards for drive-thru windows when facing a right-of-way

**SUMMARY:** Staff is proposing a Zoning Text Amendment (ZTA) to Wellington's LDRs providing alternative landscape standards for drive-thru windows when facing a right-of-way which may include additional landscaping, landscape berms three (3) feet or higher, fencing and/or any other alternative design approved by the Planning and Zoning Director or his/her designee to mitigate the impact the window may cause to passing vehicular traffic.
